

THE PROPOSED LUJAN AND SALTO RAILWAY.

Buenos Ayres, Ang. 5, 1866. To the Minister of Hacienda, Dr. D. Mariano Varela,

Hon. Sr, We, Federico and Julio Lacrozze, have submitted to the Municipalities of Lujan, Giles, Carmen de Areco, and Salto our scheme for the laying of a railway from Lujan to Salto with stations in the above-named towns and to be connected with this city by a junction at Lujan with the Western Railway. We have therefore, without further preface, the pleasure of submitting the project to your Excellency's attention, feeling assured that its own obvious advantages will be the strongest arguments in its favor.

The necessity of making a railway call at the various camp towns, and form a junction with some part of our Western line, is already a patent fact. The exigencies of commerce, and the convenience of the people alike demand it; the lazy movements of the bullock carts have left them completely behind the age, and something must now be done to meet .the two great wants of the day-a reduced rate and speedy conveyance. Besides this, the land question must not be lost sight of, and the Messrs. Lacroze are of opinion that their proposed line would open to foreign immigration some of the most fertile lands in this province.

1st. We propose running a line of railway from Lujan to Salto, with stations at Giles and Carmen de Areco, and with the option of hereafter extending the same to Rosario, on condition of receiving an annual subsidy of \$90,000 per league of road, from each the mula ipalities through whose districts the new line will run, and likewise we require a free grant of all lands requisite for the line, stations,

Of course there was much enquiry as to what Exchange the Government took; as far as we could learn the bills were drawn by different houses. We could not hear all the drawers names, but some were mentioned on the Bolsa, viz.: The River Plate Bank, Lumb Bros., T. Armstrong, Wanklyn, and others. £25,000 of the Exchange had been arranged some time back at 49; the other rates were a little over this.

> The non-arrival of the steamer with the Brazilian Minister has, as a matter of course, given rise to all sorts of rumous; some say that Curupaiti was carried after great slaughter, and others that several thousands of the allies were blown up-by a mine. These rumors are utterly destitute of authenticity; nothing has arrived, and from the state of the ground it is more reasonable to believe that there has been no fighting at all. Amongst the brokers it is said there has been another conference, but few believe this.

The projected law on the Treasury Billsris much talked of; all highly approve of Minister Varela's project, and it is the general wish amongst merchants that it should be passed. We heard on the Bolsa to-day of another project, which it is said will be presented to-night. As far as we could learn the new project is to autherize the Bank to emit in paper money the amount due by the Western Railway to the Bank. The plain object of this project is to defeat the mooted loan to the National Government; there s no probability, however, of its being passed. There were no mails to-day from Montevideo, and it is uncertain whether the French packet

has arrived or not. The steamers Gualeguay and Bueucs Ayres are hourly expected from Corrientes, but they will bring no later dates.




