



When an American mob, not many years before, had attacked the house of a mere Spanish consul in New Orleans (a representative of a much lower grade) Spain demanded, even from the powerful and somewhat dreaded United States, not alone pecuniary indemnification for the damage done, but the proper and corresponding public apology of a salute to. United States did not hesitate to accord both, and to do so liberally and largely. She made the same demand of a salute for the graver international offence which her legation and flag had received in Chili. Unlike the United States, Chili, in her bad blood and ill-will refused it. The resident Spanish Minister, Tavira, weakly (as was deemed by his Government), though in a laudable desire for accommodation, was willing to accept a mere disavowal of intention to offend, without the public demonstration of apology contained in the salute demanded, but which he found himself unable to obtain. 




