

ded under this system. For many years Mr. Ruthyen, the inventor of this mode of hydraulic action, has been endeavouring to obtain a public recognition of its value, and we are glad that now a fair chance has been afforded of giving sufficiently convincing proofs to set aside projudice, and to induce practical men to favour and develop its valuable points. The idea of propelling vessels by hydraulic power is not entirely of modern origin, but of the many attempts none succeeded until the present apparatus was designed by Mr. Buthven in 1839. Since then, under his patent, several small vessels have been constructed at different places; but although these first essays have been all favourable in their results there appears to be some opposition on the part of eminent engineers still remaining to be ter. 4. The Duke of Saxe-Cobnrgovercome.

In the practical construction of the Waterwitch the perforated double bottom is a work of labour and skill, for which credit may be well given even to the Thames Ironworks Company, famous as they are for their workmanship. The whole central portion of the underpart of the hull is perforated with a series of hundreds of funnel-like holes formed by the nicking and turning in of the nicked edges of the skin-plates in a direction away from the bow towards the interior of the vessel. Through these cavities it is that the water is sucked into the turbine, and the nicking and in-turning of the plates to form them must have tested the patience of the workmen and the quality of the iron alike.

In pitting the Waterwitch against the Vixen and the Viper it is scarcely possible, perhaps, to have had a fairer contest. Some of those gentlemen who have interested themselves in this hydraulic propeller consider, however, that in consequence of the decks being lowered in midships to form the platform for the guns the nozzles have been unavoidably placed disadvantageously lower down than was desirable, and than they would have been in an ordinary mercantile or passenger vessel. Nevertheless, they anticipate successful competition, grounding their hopes very justifiably on the satisfaction given by the Nautilus on the Thames, and we think they are right in considering that the success of this experiment cannot be too highy estimated if full support of the Government it will, of course, anything like equal speed can be obwill be obtained in navigation if sailing ships can have an auxiliary motive power attached to them without being incumbered in their sail, ing qualities with any of the deteriorating resistance of screws and paddles when not at work.

It is further urged on behalf of the hydraulic propeller that when the ship is in a seaway there are always sources of loss of power with the screw and peddle which cannot affect it, and that the safety of vessels from foundering is immensely increased by the powers of the turbine to discharge so large a body of water as to be able to overcome any probable leaks.




