THE ROADS ABOUT TOWN.

When Pizarro invaded the Kingdom of the Incas, nothing astonished him more than the fact that the land of the savages was ahead of his native country in one point at least, namely, in public roads. It is a matter of history that the road to Cuzco was built over ravines, valleys, and mountains, cut in many places through the solid rock, and at convenient distances were store-houses where the surplus harvest was kept, not only for the use of travellers, but to guard against famine in years of bad or unfavorable weather.

We mention this fact, 'in limine,' to show that it requires neither the genius of civilization nor the talent of Europeans to make roads, since the benighted worshippers of the sun excelled in this regard. ANOTHER INDIAN INVASION.

ALARMING NEWS FROM THE SOUTH

In our paper of the 1st inst. we predicted an invasion on our southern frontier, in the following words.

"A friend just arrived from Quequer Salado reports the garrison (which was 800 strong under Col. Machado) now reduced to 200, and wholly insufficient to protect the frontier in case the Indians become troublesome, as is unfortunately too likely. At the last new moon the Ranqueles and Araucanos held a pow-wow, attended by 2,000 warriors, about 40 leagues from Ojo de Agua: the supposed purpose was to make a sweep of the southern estan-






