NEWS FROM BRAKIL.

Professor Agassiz visited the Serra da Baturité notwithstanding the had roads owing to the heavy rains. However on going as far as Serras of Mangaba and Aratanha he found vestiges of the Glavial Era such as he had anticipated finding among the Baturité mountains. He discovered on the estate of Lieut. Col. Franklin de Lima a number of erratic boulders, and land raised by the action of a glacier, the house itself being built on a 'moraine'.

Another moraine was found opposite the gorge of Boduetrao separating the Serras Mangaba and Aratanha; and the village of Pacatuba was judged by the Professor to be situated at the bottom of an ancient glacier, and to be surrounded in part by its moraine, through which the river Pacatuba now flows. This glacier had two arms, as is evidenced by the wo deteral moraines.

On the highest part of the Serra were found huge boulders evidently deposited there by ice; and altogether the Professor considered the vestiges found in the region as mest satisfactorily conclusive and corroboratory of his bypothesis of the Amazonian Glacial Era.

THE MENDOZA REVOLUTION. Our French colleague, the Courrier, publishes the best account yet given of the emeute at Mendoza, in the following

Mendoza, Nov. 11th. I must tell you something about the Constant Santa Maria, H.B.M.'s present critical state of affairs here. About 2 in the morning, on the 8th inst. a revolution broke out, under the leadership of D. Manuel Arias, a Colonel of the Province of San Juan, and Pederal of the old school. The whole affair lasted about 2 hours, and at 4 a. m the rebels were masters of the barrack and artillery depot, on which the Government had counted for support. A few hours later the rebels drew out into the plaza the 8 pieces of artillery and mustered 400 strong, all well-armed. To-day, however, they reviewed a respectable force of 1200 men well-armed and equipped with all the munitions of war: most of these men are volunteers who have come from various parts to solicit arms and declare against Governor Arroyo: the latter has long since evaporated. The revolution has met with unanimons approval from all the people, and the greatest order and tranquillity

Yesterday (10th inst.) Don Carlos Juan Rodriguez assumed the reins of Government: he is a native of San Inis, and intimate friend of Juan Sas, so that you see we are again subjected to the old Federal regime.
