THE AGITATION AGAINST PRES. JOHNSON.

LATEST VIA PANAMA.

There is no substance as yet, nor does it appear as if there was likely to be, of the Radical war upon the President. Threats can be heard on all sides of impeaching him when Congress meets in December next.

Wendell Phillips made a speech at the Cooper Institute, on the 25th instant, in which he denounced the President and General Grant in outrageous terms.

A few days ago Representative Bingham, at a public meeting in Pennsylvania, stated that the President and Secretary Steward were drunk day after day, and that a lewd woman was the inmate of the White House, and ruled supremely there, and he offered to substantiate the charge.

There is a terrible Fenian excitement about the men sentenced to be hanged in Canada. The trouble that was brewing in the city of Baltimore has blown over, and the Radicals seem inclined now not to kick up a row there, simply because they feared the Governor of the State would remove the police commissioners of that city from office.

Head Centre Stephens made a speech here on Sunday last to an immense crowd of Irishmen, which was understood to be his last speech in this country previous to his departure for Ireland.

It is said that the Spanish government has purchased of the United States two monitors, at an expense of two million dollars, and, as the government has no available funds, two wealthy merchants of Havana have gone security for the amount.

Important from Frayle Muerto. GEN. PAUNERO AND THE ENGLISH SETTLERS. GRAND MEETING AND BANQUET.

Mr. Thomas Thomas, being voted to the chair, sat down under a leafy algarrobo, and introduced Capt. Wehrhan to the meeting. Among those present I noticed Messrs. Woods, Purdy, Bell, Talbot, Goodrich, Stow, Paul Roberts, Kiug, Seymour, Miller, Moffat, Sward, Douglas, Groom, Hope, McCraill, Bulbercouth, Still, Pearson, Trotter, Calder, Stoddard, Watts brothers, Hall, and others whose names I could not learn.

The chairman then called on Capt. Wehrhan to explain the object of his mission. Capt. Wehrhan said that he came by special order of Dr. Rawson, Minister of Interior, to see about establishing a fort in the most convenient position, so as to protect as far as possible the lives and properties of the British farmers at Frayle Muerto.

Mr. Purdy then stood up to offer some remarks, and requested more detailed particulars about the intended fort, which the gallant captain gave at some length. Gen. Paunero expressed the heartfelt pleasure it gave him to see so many English gentlemen settled down as sheep-farmers on the frontier of the desert.

The meeting was next addressed in turn by Messrs. Stow, Seymour, Pearson, Talbot, Woods and others, who spoke very much to the point, and declared their readiness to come forward by subscriptions towards the end proposed.

Mr. Purdy suggested the propriety of appointing a committee, and the following gentlemen were at once chosen: Messrs. Purdy, Bell, Talbot, Goodrich, and Stow.

The Chairman then proposed, and Mr. Seymour seconded, a vote of thanks to General Paunero and Capt. Wehrhan, which was passed by acclamation.

The English settlers then invited us to a splendid banquet, the first of the kind ever seen at Frayle Muerto, covers being laid for 40 persons. Every thing was of the best, and after the "dessert" several toasts were given. President Mitre's health was drunk with all honor, then Gen. Paunero's, and the latter in reply gave, in very eloquent terms, the health of Her Gracious Majesty, Queen Victoria, which was drunk with "three times three."

The banquet reflected much credit on the English residents who spared no expense towards having every thing come off well. As yet I cannot report any proceedings on the part of the committee, but in my next (the coming week) I shall have news for you respecting the return of Capt. Wehrhan who started this morning on a survey of the southern camps of Frayle Muerto. The camps are in good condition, the wood is very clear, and the stocks

This individual, who evidently cannot read a word of English, takes on himself to say that an article entitled "Another Collapsed Government," referring to the Mendoza row, was sent to us by a certain Zuloaga, the Minister of the new Governor of Mendoza.

There is great anxiety to know who will be the new Directors of the Provincial Bank. As yet nothing very certain is known, but the foreigners most likely to be named are—Henry Wyatt Smith, Samuel B. Hale, M. Bonnemason. A very long list has been talked of, but the above named gentlemen are the most likely to be appointed.

The best reaping machines are Coffin's; they are of an improved model, and all who have bought them praise them. Dr. Charles Saavedra has been elected Deputy for Zarate; he is son of our late Governor, speaks English, and we hope will make a good member.

The medals commemorative of the fight of the 25th May have been sent up to the army. General Paunero received a fine gold one, with two brilliants, worth altogether about £200 sterling.

We take the liberty of contradicting in the most emphatic manner the news published by our colleagues respecting Mr. Bell, the maker of the torpedoes. The officers of the Shamokin, when they were up at Curupaipi, obtained the fullest news as to his death.

Owing to the great scarcity this year of river craft the steamers are now becoming wool-carriers. The charge from Rosario to Buenos Ayres is only \$5 per arroba, which cannot be regarded as very dear.

Several sailors and marines of the Spanish war-vessels have been arrested on attempting to desert, and sent again aboard their vessels. A fine time for the crimps! Messrs. Zipitria and Salvañach, lately released by the Brazilian Government, are expected by next steamer from Rio.

The Agnese, from Genoa, brought 362 immigrants. Letters from Polanco, Treinta-tres, and other camp districts complain of gangs of vagabonds prowling about, and it is imperative that Gen. Flores rid the country of such characters. Mr. Samuel Bilken has had his credentials admitted, as vice-consul for Sweden and Norway.

By latest advices we learn that Sr. Riestra is at present sojourning in Ireland, and will soon return to his native country.

THE WAR IN THE NORTH. LATEST FROM HEAD-QUARTERS. INAUGURATION OF THE THEATRE.

Dec. 6th. The Paraguyans have now got heavier artillery and begun shelling us with 80-pounders, but happily without effect.

Dec. 7th. A deserter from the enemy tried last night to reach the Brazilian lines, shouting 'pasado, pasado,' but was received with a volley of musketry, one ball lodging in his leg.

Dec. 8th. A Brazilian lieutenant and 3 soldiers wounded; two more were struck by a 68-pound shot, and the enemy also threw a shell into a 'pulperia,' which made dreadful havoc among the bottles.

Dec. 9th. The explosion in the enemy's camp, at 6 p.m., was one of the most terrible sights ever witnessed; 400 shells burst through the air in all directions, along with fragments of human bodies, boards, hides, and pieces of burnt ranchos.

Dec. 10th. Gen. Castro's sergeant deserted to the enemy; he passed the lines on pretence of a special order, and soon after pulled out a white handkerchief, safely reaching the enemy's lines.

Dec. 12th. The fleet landed four 32lb. rifled guns, and seven 74-pounders, to be mounted in a battery against the enemy.

Dec. 13th. The Marques de Caxias expects to resume operations by January. Our theatre has been opened, and the first performance was attended by an immense crowd.

MONTEVIDEO. Wednesday, 19th Dec. The debut of Miss Sanchez as a professional singer, is looked forward to with much interest and confidence.

EXTRAORDINARY NEWS FROM S. JUAN.

The Eco de Cordoba publishes the following from San Juan, under date Nov. 24th. 'Four days since they arrested Padre Garramuniez, one of the canons, and locked him up in prison.

'The streets are full of women, demanding the liberation of the priest, for his orders are enforced and no Mass is celebrated. It seems the dispute arose last Sunday, when the Padre, at High Mass, publicly excommunicated the Criminal Judge, Dionisio Varela, for detaining funds belonging to the church.

NEWS FROM THE CAMPS.

WEEKLY REPORTS FOR 'STANDARD.' ROSAS. December 18, 1866. Sales of sheep, cattle, &c., in neighborhood—No sales of sheep. 400 head of cattle at \$70 mpc. No mares or horses sold.

News in town—Bread very scarce: biscuits \$70 per arroba. No flour to be had; all bought up by the Brazilians. In consequence of the fluctuating state of the city markets, and the bad state of the roads, numbers of rustic brokers are doing a brisk trade at \$52, \$55, and \$58 mpc, in small lots of middling wool.

Peone's wages, and if wanted—Any number of active young men will find ready and constant employment at \$250 to \$350 mpc as shepherds: foreigners preferred.

General remarks—The curiosity of the neighbors has been attracted by the pedestrian movements of an old native woman, who, with nothing but a 'mate' pot, travels round the whole camp. She frequently calls at the neighboring 'puestos,' but can never be prevailed upon to enter or partake of any refreshment; and the wonder is, how she lives knocking about among the wild cattle. The other day she got lost in the thistles. It is really a crying shame the authorities do not take care of her.

There is, indeed, great need of reform in the management of sheep estancias, and we are sanguine that this book of Mr. Latham—which we understand, is also to be published in Spanish—will be a potent means of promoting a movement in this direction of the utmost consequence to the material development of the Argentine Republic.

The prevailing idea amongst sheep-farmers in the Plate a few years back was to produce fineness of staple and this was sought to be grafted on an infinite variety of sheep. To such an extent was this carried, to the exclusion of other equally important considerations, that the weight of the fleeces has been gradually reduced, whilst its elasticity has been very seriously affected by the pernicious habit of allowing the rams to run with the flocks at all seasons of the year.

As a consequence of this practice, the increase of many flocks—the offspring often of aged and immature ewes—rapidly degenerated into a condition of weakness and debility highly prejudicial to the best interests of the owner. Proper care, too, as a rule, is not taken to protect the flocks from the weather; the camps in many instances are overstocked, especially in Buenos Ayres; the sheep are very frequently exposed to inequality of maintenance, whereby the growth of the young animals is prematurely arrested; and they are habitually put up at night in corrales reeking with filth, generating unhealthy and unwholesome vapours. Such, in brief, are the cardinal evils unapparently characteristic of the existing system of sheep-breeding; and if Mr. Latham only succeeds in stimulating the estancieros of the country to well-directed efforts for the improvement of their flocks, and to the adoption of a course of management more in harmony with sound and well defined principles, he will have established a valid claim to the gratitude of all in any way interested in the progress of the River Plate States.
