R. Plate Mail. THE ATLANTIC CABLE.

We are as yet without news of the Great Eastern and the Atlantic cable. The numerous speculations as to the accident which has arisen it would be Eastern, the Terrible, or the Sphynx. at an English or American port with intelligence. It is not improbable that first advices may come from St. John's, Newfoundland, via New York, as in the very likely event of her Majesty's ships running short of coal they would make for the nearest port for supplies.

It would be dangerous for vessels such as the Terrible and the Sphynx to attempt coaling from the Great East ern in the Atlantic, and therefore one or the other of them may have proceeded to Newfoundland with the ob ject of obtaining coal and transmitting intelligence, leaving the Great Eastern to under-run or recover and repair the cable. The supposition that the Great Eastern's engines may have broken down would not account for the ces sation of signals, as if her consorts were not short of coal they would be able to tow her. ...


