LATEST FROM MATTO-GROSSO.

From Matto-Grosso there is nothing of note, and matters seem in statu quo. The latest accounts report the Paraguayans as not having passed beyond Coxim so that the fears entertained of their attack on Santa Anna do Paranahiba and Itapurá were subsiding, especially as the Minas Brigade and that of San Paulo, together with 12 individual who lately commanded the pieces of rifled cannon, were on the point of junction at Uberaba, and, with some other troops that would join them there, would furnish about 3,000 men for the defence of the line of the Paraná, or to push on into Matto Grosso. At all events the Government seem of this opinion as they have ordered the drafts from the central, eastern, and northern parts of Minas pecting it. LATEST FROM MINAS GERAES.

The Minas Brigade under Colone Galvao arrived at Uberaba on the 21st June. The force consisted of 1,053 the losses from desertions and sickness having amounted to 159. With a reinforcement from Uberaba the number was raised to 1,173 and the old clothes worn out on the journey were replaced by others forwarded to them. Desertion and sickness were much diminished. The 12 pieces of artillery were still behind but would probably reach them before leaving Uberaba. The President has issued orders that the contingents of the national guard in the east, north, and centre should be forwarded in companies to Rio.

At Diamantina a band of ranaway slaves had sacked a house in the suburbs and killed a guest and one of two women residing in it, another escaping only by feigning death.


