#### BURNOS AYRES NORTHERN RAIL WAY CO.

A discussion has arisen in the columns of a contemporary respecting the good faith of the Buenos Ayres Government in its treatment of the Sharehol ders of the Northern Railway, in consequence of certain unfounded charges made by a Shareholder of the name of Smith. Those of our readers who are acquainted with the facts of the case will not require to be assured that the conduct of the Buenos Ayres Government towards the Northern Railway Company has been exceedingly liberal and that any delays and misfortunes which have occurred are solely attri butable to the admittedly defective construction of the line, and to the attempt of the Directors to work it independently of the Government guarantee. The business of the railway was such as to justify considerable confidence in the result, and the Com pany accordingly prayed to be relieved from an official inspection of the works, feeling persuaded, no doubt, that their the end, affording, as they would, a condition was not likely to give satishowever, found that the working expenses almost absorbed the receipts, and the Directors applied for the guarantee upon £ 150,000 actually expen ded in construction.
