AWFUL DOINGS IN CENTRAL AMERICA.

We have received the 'Mercurio' to August 31st, and exchanges from Cenral America to July 13th. The news from everywhere is disastrous and dis graceful to humanity: except Chile, the whole Continent is spilling blood.

The rebellion has gained great ground in Peru: the power of President Pezet may be considered reduced to the walls of Lima, the garrison consisting of \$,040 men hastily levied under General Frisancho. The rebel forces comprise the army of the South under the Vice-President-7,000: and the army of the North under Colonel Balta 5,000 men: the former occupies Pasco Tarma, Janja, and Huancayo; the lat-The rebel fleet on anchoring at Callao summoned the Government vessels to surrender, but at an intimation from H.B.M.S. Leander, left port and proceeded to the Chinchas. Subsequently the two English war-vessels went out side the port, and the rebels returned. but the Spanish, French, and Italians lay at their anchorage, and the 3 Gov ernments corvettes to leeward ap parently unalarmed.
