GREAT DAY IN THE PLAZA ONCE DE SETIEMBRE.

INAUGURATION OF THE BARRACA DEL FERRO CARRIL.

SPLENDID DEJEUNER, SPEECHES, ETC.

Last Sunday morning the dull wool market known as the Plaza Once de Setiembre was enlivened by one of those festive scenes called house-warmings at home, and inaugurations here. Messrs. Klengel & Co.'s magnificent new barraca, which has just been opened to the public, was the scene of the greatest rejoicing. Mr. Klengel, having determined to send to his partner in Europe a photographic view of the new concern, invited a few of his friends to attend on the occasion. As early as 8 o'clock a.m. the company began to arrive and at 9 precisely the first negative was taken. We noticed present the following gentlemen: Messrs. Bletcher, Roth, Hiltz, Tritaut, Krutisch, Loeven, Peters, Koch, Banks, Klappenback sr., Carl Klappenback, Napp, Scharff, Santiago Klappenback, Wartemberg, Bertram, Pickenpack, Buttner, Buschmann, Niebuhr, Camann, Luders and lady, Heuser, Christiani, Ivan Mohr, G. Mohr, Seyfert Klappenback, Crus, Prange, Hunt, Schroeder, Wiedemann, Clauseu, Klengel, Sachan, Von Eicken, Duckwitz, Cropp, Meyn, and several other gentlemen whose names we did not know. At ten o'clock the number of gentlemen present had greatly increased, the artist took another negative, and the company having adjourned to the baling department, the ceremony of making the first bale of the new wool was performed. When the bale was hooped and thrown out from the press, Mr. Mohr, a leading barraquero, stepped forward and in a few appropriate words expressed the hope that this bale would be the forerunner of thousands of bales which would yet issue from this barraca. (great cheers). The whole party then sat down to a splendid 'dejeuner a la fourchette.' After the eatables were discussed, and the wine began to flow, Mr. Mohr rose and proposed the health of the new firm of Klengel & Co., which was drunk with three-times-three and the most vociferous applause, the whole company rising and touching glasses with Mr. Klengel and his partner present. A jovial German chorus was then introduced by the company. Mr. Seyfert, of the firm of Fels & Seyfert, gave the next toast; he said that, as the friend of one of the absent partners in the new firm, Mr. Spilcken, he would ask the company to drink the health of this respected gentleman, whose friendship and acquaintance nearly all present enjoyed; Mr. Spilcken was at present in Europe in precarious health, and let us then drink to his speedy recovery and return to the River Plate, and success and prosperity to the firm of which he is a partner. (great cheering). Drank with all the honors.

Mr. Klengel then rose and said, that he regretted sincerely his friend Mr. Spilcken had robbed him of the toast which he purposed giving. Mr. Spilcken had indeed proved a good friend to him. He had been now 24 years in Buenos Ayres struggling against contrary winds and with but checkered success. Mr. Spilcken was a friend of his, and had now come forward to help him with his capital and open up for him a new career, he thanked all the kind friends present for the honor they had done him in attending at the inauguration of this new barraca to-day and for their kind wishes for the success and prosperity of his firm, but he could not also omit to avail himself of the present opportunity to thank publicly his partner Mr. Spilcken who had

so nobly supplied him with the funds necessary to build this barraca, he could not now propose that gentleman's health since Mr. Seyfert had stole a march on him, but he would ask the company to drink to True friendship. Great cheering: Mr. K. resumed his seat.

Mr. Bletcher, rose and said that none more than himself regretted the absence of Mr. Spilcken, and his illness; he hoped that Mr. S. would find better doctors in Europe than we have here, and would speedily recover; but he had a word to say about 'barraqueros,' he had had much dealings with them, and although he had no complaint against them, either as a body, or individually, he found these respectable gentlemen thorough business men, Mr. Klengel is a new beginner, and he for one hoped that therefore it would be easier to deal with him (great laughter and applause).

Mr. Bertram, rose and proposed Mr. Bletcher's health, he said, Mr. B. was a renowned buyer, a leading exporter, and regretted he found the 'barraqueros' so hard to deal with, Mr. Bletcher however only bought in the Plaza Once de Setiembre, and therefore his experience of the 'barraqueros' was limited to those of that plaza, (great laughter and cheering) he hoped that henceforth Mr. Bletcher would extend his purchases to Barracas (great cheers) where he would find the 'barraqueros' very easy to deal with, easier than even the newest 'barraqueros' of the Once de Setiembre, (tremendous cheering and laughter) he would propose Mr. Bletcher's health and prosperity to him (drank with 3 times 3).

Mr. Mohr, rose and said, that as a 'barraquero' of the Once de Setiembre, he protested against the imputation Mr. Bletcher had to his knowledge bought in Barracas (great cheering and hurrahs for Bletcher).

Mr. Prange, rose and said, that he proposed success and prosperity to the Barraca del Ferro-Carril, it had commenced its career under the most smiling auspices; this magnificent establishment which we all inspected this day was now ready to receive the wool of the country; in a few days the Plaza would be crowded with carts, and he hoped that these capacious galpones would also be filled with wool; we had all seen the bale of wool, the first bale of this establishment, and he hoped that ere long the bales of the Barraca del Ferro-Carril would enjoy in Antwerp, Havre, and the States a reputation equal to that of Mr. Klengel here (great cheers).

Mr. Bertram, rose and proposed the health of the only lady present, Mrs. Luders, who had so graciously condescended to be present at the inauguration of this Barraca. It was a happy omen, he thought for his friend Mr. Klengel who he hoped ere long would have a lady to share in the administration of domestic affairs, in fact a wife was the only thing Klengel required in this splendid establishment [great cheering and laughter]. Mrs. Luders' health was drunk with all the honors, the whole company joining in a German chorus.

Mr. Krus [of the firm of Bove & Co.] called for full bumpers and rose to propose the 'Standard,' that journal which fearlessly attacked every abuse and is the legitimate organ of the industry and commerce of the country, [vociferous applause and drunk with three times three, and hurrah for the 'Standard']

Mr. Klengel then proposed the health of Messrs. Hunt and Schroeder, the great architects of Bs. Ayres: it was their genius that called into existence the Barraca del Ferro-Carril, and he asked the company to drink to their health. Drank amidst the greatest applause.

Mr. Klappenback, Sen. next gave in poetry the health of the three partners in the new [Messrs. Spilcken, Klengel, and Warsenburg] drunk with all the honors. A call being made for Mr. Mulhall.

Mr. E. T. Mulhall then rose and said that he felt extreme diffidence in responding to the call made on him, inasmuch as unfortunately he could not speak German, the language of the hour; he wished, however, to return thanks for the complimentary manner in which the health of the 'Standard'

was drunk; he had attended many railway and other inaugurations, but this was the first barraca inauguration he had had the good luck to be at, and he hoped it would not be the last; he felt the honor paid to the 'Standard' by inviting him to this interesting and jovial ceremony; around him he saw the leading barraqueros of Buenos Ayres, gentlemen of the highest honor and integrity, and he felt proud to be in such distinguished company; he again thanked Mr. Klengel for the honor of inviting him to this festive board, and wished Mr. Klengel and his barraca the greatest prosperity. [cheers.]

Mr. Klengel next gave "Those we love," stating candidly that he had no other claim on his affections than little Miss Ella Mohr, who was about to leave in the packet for Europe, taking with her a photographic view of the barraca; if, however, the matter was put to vote he believed all would agree with him in voting that she should remain.

Mr. Bertram gave the next toast, "Joy," which was drunk in a most joyous manner.

Mr. Klengel next proposed "The Clerks," and said he had no doubt, from what he knew of these gentlemen, they deserved every thanks and praise from their employers, whose interests they assiduously watched. Drank with three-times-three.

Mr. Bertram rose and said that, although, as a general rule, Doctors were unwelcome guests, still he hailed with pleasure the arrival of Dr. Christiani in the Plaza Once to-day; he is welcome at this festive board, but if report be true he is still more welcome in a neighboring barraca, where his services will be required as 'accoucheur'; he would propose the health of Dr. Christiani, and may he always do his best to increase the number of juvenile barraqueros. Great laughter and applause, and three cheers for Mr. Crus.

Mr. Hauser rose and said: Mr. Meyer, who is going to Europe by the next steamer, will be the bearer of the portrait just taken, for Mr. Spilcken, and proposed his health and a pleasant voyage.

There were several other toasts, but our paper being exhausted we were unable to report them: at half past 1 o'clock the company rose and departed highly delighted with the agreeable reunion.

GOOD NEWS FOR BUENOS AYRES.
 The English mails this time have put every one in good humour, and for once there is a unanimous feeling that the Mersey has brought very good news. The Government has received from Sor Riestra a second handsome remittance of £100,000 sterling, and we learn from a correspondent's letter that the Loan may be negotiated in Germany on even more favorable terms than in London.

The merchants have good reason to flatter themselves for the market-reports of wool, tallow, and other produce: hides have gone up one-eighth of a penny, tallow 4 shillings per cwt., and the advices from New York say that all the River Plate wools have been bought up and are in demand. Our exporters are likely to make considerable profits, thanks to their foresight in buying up lately all the tallow: the Georgina and several other vessels are on the way to England with large invoices.

Our naval friends will be glad to learn that the Satellite got home safe. The first vessel of the new American and Brazilian Steam-Navigation Co. was to leave New York on Sept. 28th. A new fast-sailing steamer, just launched, called the Imogene, was to leave Liverpool for Brazil on Sept. 12th: she was probably at first intended for a blockade-runner. The Montana steamer, which brought the Hon. Mr. Washburn to Rio was also bearer of some twenty emigration-agents for as many societies of people from the Southern States, coming to settle in Brazil, making in all some 50,000 persons. We learn nothing about the Harrison steam-boat Co., or Capt. Bruce's new vessel, or the Cordoba Land Co.

The indefatigable Mr. E. B. Neill is likely to succeed in his S. American beef-agitation, and many eyes are turned to the River Plate with its pampas teeming with healthy cattle, while the

distemper in Europe is causing terrible ravages but happily has not yet reached Ireland. People at home have little interest in the progress of the Paraguayan war, but the increased attention given to River Plate matters is very remarkable: as a proof of this, we have received 7 new advertisements from London firms.

The Northern Railway Co. held a special meeting, at which high compliments were passed on Sor Riestra, and no charge of dishonesty alleged against the B. Ayrean Government. The Great Southern also held a meeting at which it was proposed to add Mr. Armstrong to the Board of Directors in this city.

LATEST FROM PARAGUAY.
MELANCHOLY DEATH OF MR. WHYTEHEAD.
IMPORTANT NEWS OF THE WAR.
 By a sailing-vessel from Asuncion, we have received news from that city to the end of August. The movements of troops and war-materials were on a great scale, and fresh levies every day coming in from the rural districts. Mr. Atherton died about the middle of August of heart-disease: he was the only English merchant in the country, and well-known in Buenos Ayres. Mr. Grant, superintendent of working-department at the Arsenal, died in the beginning of September, of inflammation of the liver. Mr. Whytehead, chief of the Arsenal, was found dead in his quinta, having hanged himself in a fit of insanity: the deceased gentleman had been suffering from monomania for nearly two years, and will prove an irreparable loss to Paraguay.

Lopez is at Humayta, and intends to take command of the army: the fleet of 12 steamers, and a garrison of 10,000 men are also there. General Robles is in prison on a charge of drunkenness. Lopez bitterly complains of all his commanders. The fall of Uruguayana was only known to a few. Colonel Resquin is in command of the Grand Army at Cuevas, which is stated at from 22,000 to 30,000 men. Berjes is at Corrientes, where there is only a small garrison of 500 men: Barrios has also come down.

Some Italian vessels were detained at Corrientes, but the Veloce succeeded in getting them free. The batteries at Cuevas have all been dismantled, and on the 7th inst. not a gun remained in position.

The town of Goya is deserted, the whole army of Resquina having set out to march. The Brazilian fleet is still lying at Rincon de Soto.

The railway works in Paraguay were stopped when the war first commenced with the invasion of Matto-Grosso.

The ladies carried off from Corrientes are still detained at Humayta. Surgeon-General Stewart and Staff is at Humayta. Mr. P. C. Bliss has been entrusted with charge of the late Mr. Atherton's affairs. Mr. Marshall succeeds Mr. Whytehead in charge of the Arsenal. Messrs. Valpy, Burrell, Thompson, and the other English residents in Paraguay are quite well. Dr. Barton and lady have come down to Corrientes. The flying-fish was bought in that city by the Paraguayo Correntino authorities. The French hair-dresser in Asuncion was put in prison for selling gloves without a license, and after much suffering was released, but died soon after.

SPANISH PRETENSIONS IN CHILE.
 After the first surprise, on hearing of the blockade of Valparaiso, has passed away, people in Buenos Aires seem little interested about the question between Spain and Chile, so much so that even the newspapers have not taken the trouble to argue which is right in the matter. It is indeed wonderful with what stoicism we can regard the misfortunes of our neighbors! and if the next mail from beyond the Andes bring us the news that Valparaiso has been bombarded, the idea will occur to every one that it has probably been attended with great destruction to property and much inconvenience to the inhabitants.

The general opinion among Englishmen is in favor of Chile, and this is the more remarkable since in the case of Peru it was decidedly in favor of Spain. Being able as we are to judge

with entire impartiality and with full knowledge of the merits of the case the decision of the British public in the River Plate should be worth some weight, although backed by no iron-clads, nor likely to influence in the issue of the quarrel. The reason why we approved the energetic action of Spain towards Peru was the impunity for the massacre of Talambo, when unoffending and unarmed Spaniards were murdered with connivance of the authorities: in this case it was requisite for Spain to avenge this innocent blood, and make her flag respected. But against Chile there is no complaint of any one Spanish resident having been injured in his person or property, and the whole grievance may be said to resolve itself into a ton of coal.

It is impossible to read the notes sent by Admiral Pareja to the Chilean Government without feeling inwardly convinced that, under the high-sounding terms of "ultimatum" and "explanation," he is attempting to bully an insignificant Republic, and impose humiliating reparations for imaginary offences. He refuses even to entertain any terms of arrangement unless a salute be fired (as a preliminary) to the Spanish flag. The gallant Admiral has certainly the double merit of having brought Peru to reason and acquitted his Government of any designs of conquest by giving back the Chincha Islands when that Republic submitted. But he can expect little glory by bringing his powerful fleet against the defenceless port of Valparaiso because they refused to sell him coal. Reclamations and diplomatic protests would be all very well, but it is a serious matter to put on blockades and threaten bombardment, especially against a weak adversary. In this question about the ton of coal, the conduct of Spain is a notable contrast with the longanimity and patience of Great Britain towards Mexico.

The Spanish fleet in the Pacific is fully able to carry out any threat of the haughty Admiral, comprising some of the finest war-vessels afloat, and making up a formidable strength of men and artillery. The 'Numancia' iron-clad is a magnificent floating citadel, equal to the best of England or France: the 'Villa Madrid, Blanca, and Berenguela' steam-frigates may be set down as first-class men-of-war, the first named being the Admiral's flag-ship, and all three armed with heavy rifled-cannon and the best appliances of modern warfare: the 'Resolucion, Covadonga, Vencedora and Victoria' are war-steamer carrying a smaller armament and crew; and besides these there are three or four brigs or transports, making in all a dozen ships of war carrying 300 guns and about 4,000 men.

Chile can hardly be said to have any fleet: the old 'Esmeralda' is not fit to venture out of port; the 'Maule' is only an armed passenger steamer; the 'Maypu' and a few small craft make up the semblance of a navy: in a word, the days of Lord Cochrane are gone by. As to land-defences, the Minister of War in his last Message to Congress shewed how utterly destitute the Republic was of any forts on the seaboard, and advised the immediate construction of two: it is now rather late to think of this, although we see they have begun to pull down the old fort at Valparaiso, as if to rebuild it.

No resistance can be offered if the Spaniards begin to shell Valparaiso, and the other ports of Concepcion, Coquimbo, Valdivia, Talcahuano &c., are equally at the mercy of the aggressors: Nay, it would be almost as easy for them to land and seize Valparaiso: this is the best town in Chile, with a population of some 40,000 souls, of which more than half are foreign, and connected by railway with the capital, Santiago. The regular army of Chile is about 5,000 men, and the National Guards are of course more numerous but less effective. It would, therefore, seem that Chile must succumb, like Peru, to so powerful an enemy, notwithstanding the loud speeches and exuberant enthusiasm: foreign nations will hardly interfere, and even the rebels in Peru will be unable to lend any effective aid.

If, however, the Chileans can hold out for any time, and enlist American privateers to prey on Spanish commerce in the Atlantic, Marshal O'Donnell would then find he had to combat a

new and indomitable enemy, and the war with Chile, besides the great difficulty of distance, would perhaps be attended with complications in Cuba or in Spain itself. At present it is difficult to foresee the issue and there seems no hope of arrangement between the combatants, but the cause of human progress will receive a decided check by the ill-timed exigencies of the Spanish Government—all about a ton of coal.

EDITOR'S TABLE.
 The arrival of some Englishmen from Paraguay yesterday with the distressing news of the deaths of Messrs. Whitehead and Atherton caused quite a sensation in town, we give full details in another column.

Further particulars respecting the sad accident on board the French packet were received yesterday from Montevideo; the Captain is badly injured and twenty-six or twenty-seven between passengers and crew killed; it appears that the donkey engine was working and all hands on board occupied, the engine room being neglected until the boiler got red hot, whereupon one of the engineers pumped some water into the boiler and this caused the explosion. We heard yesterday the most heartrending accounts which we refrain from publishing.

The Brazilian ironclad Brazil, has at last arrived. She anchored along side the Nitheroy and will go up the river as soon as the Admiral arrives from Concordia.

Mr. Wheelwright did not arrive yesterday as was expected, he is waiting in Rosario for the Minister of Finance.

The Satellite has arrived in England, all safe and sound, with the officers and crew of the Dotterel on board.

A serious row occurred in Barracas on Sunday; the Commissario and some half-dozen of soldiers were called into requisition to quiet the row; some few made prisoners, but no one hurt.

A farmer from San Vicente informs us that out in that neighborhood the sheepfarmers are paying from \$70 to \$80 per 100 for shearing.

The Boca Railroad on Sunday, as usual, did an immense business; the trains had extra cars on, and yet could hardly accommodate all the passengers.

There is every hope, we hear, of getting the Pampero afloat; Mr. Pollock, with his men, is working at her and she soon will be fit to be taken round to the Boca.

The Shell-drake, that miserable speculation of one of our Montevidean colleagues, is about to be taken from the Tigre, and put on the Colonia and Iiguazuitas route.

To-day the Esmeralda is due from Corrientes, she will bring very important news it is thought from that quarter. The whole Cuevas battery has been removed, so it is possible the squadron will move up.

There is no very important news from the provinces, by the Iron King; everything the same as when we last heard from there. The sheepfarmers in Santa Fé had commenced to shear.

In Belgrano, on Sunday, a rather unpleasant row occurred, which resulted in several parties being locked up; the place was crowded all day. At the Tigre there were regattas, &c.; the fashionable boat-owners were on the water.

To-morrow we will publish the entries for the English races and a revised betting list. At the Casino yesterday, the Tattersalls of Buenos Ayres, there was great betting animation about the Star of the South.

LATEST FROM MONTEVIDEO.
 October 13.
 The Mersey arrived last night, and leaves for your city to-day.

The weather is insufferably hot, the high wind, and the clouds of dust which literally cover the town, portend a heavy storm. The 'Blue Peter,' notwithstanding, is still flying at the mast-head of the Mersey, and Captain Curlew, I believe, is not a man to be easily frightened at the prospect of stormy weather on his voyage across to your side of the river. I therefore write these few lines in great haste.
