### STRANGOMMUNICATION WITH THE UNITED STATES.

The first steamer of the new line from New York to Brazil was to leave papers. on the 28th ult. and may be expected to arrive at Rio Janeyro this week or next. At the same time a smaller steamer. of 1,200 tons, was to accompany the former, for a branch-service to the River Plate, so that within a few days we shall find our city placed in direct communication with the United States. These steamers will make monthly trips, and perform the voyage from Buenos Ayres to New York in about 30 days. Besides the three oceansteamers (Merrimac, Mississippi and Havanna) already placed on the line, the company is building several magnificent vessels in every way suited to the greatness of the enterprise and the promised increase of commerce on the

The public of Buenes Ayres does not seem to attach due importance to this opening of direct steam-navigation with the United States, which we believe is destined to work a great revolution in the trade of the country. The Custom-house statistics of Brazil shew that since the establishment of steamcommunication wit Great Britain the commerce of the former country has quintupled; and in fact we may regard it as an axiom of the 19th century that railways and steamboats are the parents of industry, progress, and national wealth. Hitherto Brazil and La Plata were cut off from intercourse with a moiety of the world of commerce and civilization, but now this American line promises to complete the epoch of regeneration begun by the Royal Mail Packet Co.

### THE CHARGES AGAINST THE CO-MANDANTE OF BAHIA BLANCA.

The Justice of Peace of Bahia Blanca has initiated a terrible accusation against Col. Llano, with reference to the recent execution of a corporal named Calisto Gonsalez.

It seems Gonsalez returned late one evening to the fort, alleging as his excuse that he had to take up behind himon horseback a comrade whose horse broke down and was left behind about a league distant. His officer reprimanded him and ordered him at once to set out on foot in the dark night and look for the lost animal. Gonsalez refused, unless he were allowed a horse, whereupon the officer drew his sword, to strike the offender: the latter did the same and rushed upon the officer, using bad language and calling on his comrades to join him. The disorder was however repressed, the officer ordering Gonsalez to retire to his quarters and pretending to forgive the occurrence. Next day the corporal was sent on duty as usual. But when the affair was laid before Col. Llano, he summoned a court-martial composed of six officers of the same battalion of Nat. ### DEVASTATING HURRICANE IN THE SOUTH PACTFIC.

The government has received official information, dated May 22, narrating the devastating effects of the terrific hurricane which has visited the Society South American railway enterprise by Harney and Palmerston Islands, and most probably others. One of the Palaway, rendering navigation extremely dangerous. Nothing but the coral breakers remain, which, in case of a heavy sea, are entirely-invisible to the eye, but in perfectly calm wather they are observable. All these islands are well known to whalers in the South Sea. Owing to this damage by the hurricane several vessels have been wrecked, but so far as known none were American.
