THE PARAGUAYAN PRISONERS. Some three or four hundred prison ers have arrived in this city, from the seat of war, and as yet we are ignorant what the Government intends to do with them. As the shearing-season has just commenced, the best thing certainly would be to send them out to the camp, where hands are so scarce owing to the war. In this manner the poor fellows, who have undergone such hardships in the service of Lopez, would at the same time be of much service to B. Aires and find their banishment to strange country mitigated by kind treatment and the prospect of an hono. rable livelihood. The custom hitherto observed of making them domestic servants in town, to favored families, smacks too much of slavery; but when sent to the camp as peons, it is quite different.

We understand several estanciero have already applied to Government for some of these men, and as it might be inconsistent to expect that they prisoners of war), and highly inconvenient to keep them idle here in town peans.

In this manner Buenos Ayres will receive a decided benefit, to compensate for the escrifices of the present war. and we could wish that the rest of the action is guarded by immense 'rejas' Paraguayan prisoners in Gen.
