A new beginner came to buy sheep of a farmer two years ago; the farmer had only one flock of sheep and yet asked the purchaser four different prices: 30\$ a head if the seller was allowed to pick, 45\$ by the cut, 55\$ if the purchaser himself picked, and 653 the four.


