The latest accounts from the army, at Ayala-Cué, Nov. 2nd, are very afcontinue to be decimated by disease: fever carry them off in great numbers. The uncertainty of their fate and other moral suffering no doubt accelerates this mortality among them, which is now spreading to our own ranks. We have already lost Capt. Rissetto, and Capts. Nicolorich and Freyre have had a narrow escape. Dysentery, also, is making awful havoc, and cannot be entirely attributed to bad meat, but rather to the 'physique' and habits of the men. During the siege of Uruguayana neither besiegers nor besieged had anything to eat for two days, after which they ate too much and suffered from indigestion. The Paraguayans are not much accustomed to meat, and disobeyed the medical prohibition, stealing it whenever they could and eating it half-raw: hence their cure is beyond hope. Add to this the want of medicines, exposure to a hot sun, sometimes two days up to our knees in mud, and half-naked, all which foment disease and increase the mortality.

" In the 1st Argentine corps d'armée we have a temporary hospital with 80 of those most dangerously ill, not to speak of 500 left at Mercedes in the hands of a quack. A very bilious temperament is observable in the whole army, but the measles have completely disappeared. Pulmonary affec tions, pleurisy and colds prevail to a certain extent, not unfrequently complicated with typhoid fever. In the 2nd corps d'armée they are much better off, having no Paraguayans, and very few sick. Of our 500 and odd sick two-thirds are Paragnayan prisoners, the number of our own sick shewing little alteration. It would be advisable for Pres. Mitre to send away these Paraguayans, as they are of no possible use at head-quarters, but a great inconvenience, and dangerous to the health of the Argentine troops."


