MATIS FROM CORDOVA. ALARMING MEWS FROM CHILE. EUMORED CAPTURE OF VALPARAISO. THE MONTONEROS IN SAN JUAN.

GOVERNOR CAMPOS, NOT CAUGHT.

We have received the 'Eco de Cordeba' of the 19th inst. Some pas sengers arrived by diligence from Rio Cuarto brought news that a special courier had passed through that town en route from Chile to Rosario with men. despatches for the Argentine Government, announcing that the Spanish fleet had seized all the Chilian warvessels and merchant-shipping in Valparaiso, and taken possession of that city. The news requires confirmation, but if true the National Government must be already in possession of same

Latest dates from San Juan are to Oct. 29th. Two shocking murders have been committed in that province. An industrious young man named Vargas was coming towards the city of San Juan, when he fell into the hands of Aguero's band of Rioja freebooters: seeing that they were resolved to take his life, he begged leave to send by them a last message to his family, whereupon they plucked out his tongue and shortly after cut his throat. An other youth, only married six weeks before in Buenos Ayres, having gone to visit some friends in San Juan, was on his return through the Province of ed public surveyor for the Province.
