GREAT NEWS FROM CORRIENTES

LOPEZ SENDS PRACE PROPOSALS.

IMPORTANT FROM HUMAYTA.

Don Estevan Rams brought us yes terday the welcome news of the arrival of a Paraguayan steamer, at Corrientes with despatches from Lopez to scorching heat of Sunday, down along Pres. Mitre, supposed to contain proposals of peace and to have reference also to the mission of the French roads. thrown into alarm by the news that a Cordova, about to travel in Europe, Paragnavan steamer was in sight, but she was soon discovered to carry a white flag in token of truce. The Brazilian gunboats Ivahy and Araguary were despatched to meet her, and found her aground on the Atajo bank She was the Flying-fish and carried no armament; and the commander, Capt. John W. Horgan, lowering a boat came on board the Ivahy stating he had despatches to deliver in person to Admiral Barroso. Accordingly Capt. Alonso sent him in a boat to the Admiral, who found the despatches were from President Lopez, to Don Bartolomé Mitre, President of the Argentine Republic, and he at once forwarded them to Governor Lagrana. Meantime just before dark the Libertad and Aguary succeeded in getting the Flying-fish off the bank and accompanied her into port.

It was thought she would not be allowed to return to Paraguay, less some new ruse be intended, as for se veral days 4 or 5 Paraguayan steamers had been sighted at a distance near the Tres Bocas. Nevertheless the captain having requested permission to return, next morning, as his instructions were 'not to wait for a reply,' she steamed back for Humaytá at 8.30 a.m. on the 24th.

All kinds of conjectures are affoat at Corrientes, some thinking the flag of truce is only for an exchange of prisoners, others that it brought offers of peace, and while some are for refusing any arrangement except the expulsion of Lopez, there are many who feel tired after the 8 months' prefer an honorable peace to the arduous problem of invading the enemy's country. In any event the arrival of the flag of truce from Paraguay is certainly a good sign.

Captain Horgan gives some interesting news about Humaitá. He says that Captain Mazzini is alive, at Villa del Pilar. The Flying-fish left Humaytá at 3 p.m. on the 22nd, the Paraguayan fleet of 11 steamers being then at anchor there, ready for action, but the crews not aboard. The batteries were strengthened, counting now 230 guns in position. The Spanish and Argentine Consuls (the second in irons) remain at Humaitá, but the families carried off from Corrientes are at Asuncion, where they receive one ration in 24 hours. There was only one Paraguayan war-steamer at the capital: we hear nothing about the Decidee.
