FRANCE.

THE EMPEROR IS STILL IN PARIS, and the Cholera has almost disappeared.

THE GOVERNMENTS OF GREAT BRITAIN, Italy, Spain, Rome, Russia, Turkey, Prussia, Holland, Belgium and Denmark have accepted Napoleon's proposal of a Sanitary Congress to be held at Constantinople.

THE NEW INSURRECTION IN ALGIERS is unimportant: on the 19th Oct. Si-Sala appeared in the South, with 2,000 horse and 1,400 foot, but beat a hasty retreat on the approach of the French.

WE READ OF THE FRENCH TROOPS already beginning to evacuate Rome, embarking at Civita Vecchia, and it is thought that at the opening of the French Chambers on Dec. 15th, the Government will also announce the withdrawal of some troops from Mexico.

THE GERMAN PAPERS represent the arrangement almost concluded between Prussia and Austria, whereby the latter, for a pecuniary consideration cedes her rights to Holstein in favor of Prussia.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

The arrival of the Arno yesterday with the English mails, filled the town with news. The Cordova, Capt. Batt, arrived in Montevideo on Tuesday evening, and through the kindness and attention of the Captain we received Liverpool and London papers of the 10th, being half-a-day later than the mail.

Yesterday was a great day at Barracas, it being the feast day of Santa Lucia. On Tuesday night the whole of the Calle Larga was lit up by numerous bonfires, and crowds of visitors from town thronged the road.

We see in the list of passengers by the packet a number of subscribers who have been sojourning in Europe. We welcome them all back to the River Plate.

To-day the Buenos Ayres Great Southern Railway will be opened to the public. The first train starts at 9 a.m., and the second at 4 p.m. from the Plaza Constitucion, and from Chascomus at 9:40 a.m., and 3:40 p.m. The fare to Chascomus is \$135, being even less than what the diligences charged.

There will be no grand ceremonial opening, but the Directors, with the engineers and a few friends, go to Chascomus to-day in the first train. We promise our readers a full description of the trip in Saturday morning's paper.

The Rio Parana trip to Ensenada for the benefit of the soldier's families only amounts to \$7,260. This is a small sum for a picnic excursion, and we doubt if it covers the expenses.

The elections for Governor of Corrientes were to have come off on Monday. Camelino, we hear, is about the most likely person to be Lagragna's successor. Governor Lagragna we hear has suffered so much by the Paraguayan war that, although last year a millionaire, to-day he is almost a beggar.

The main body of the Brazilian army at latest dates was at a place ten leagues this side of Corrientes; it is possible that the army is in the environs of the city by this time. A wing of the Brazilian army, 20,000 strong, with Flores at its head, is at the Tranquero de Loreto, ready to pop into Paraguay in a moment's notice.

private letter from Corrientes says that if Mendez, of Buenos Ayres, will accept the post of Governor there can be no doubt the people would elect him. Admiral Murature has had a conference with the French commander of the Decidée on board, after which they set off to visit President Mitre, and all sorts of rumors are current as to the business. It is generally supposed that the Paraguayans meditate another descent on the city of Corrientes as the place is at present well stocked and the army was some leagues off. The Paraguayans are making stone fortifications at the Paso de la Patria, and there, on that spot, will be decided the fate of Paraguay, for a bloody battle, such as never before occurred in South America, will be fought there. The allies will have to fight under many difficulties.

In Montevideo there has been an attempt at a duel between Ramirez and Gimenez, both of whom were frightened off the ground by the wide awake Chief of Police. Bustamante, owing to the continued illness of Sr. Varela, editor of the Montevideoan 'Tribuna,' is about to lay down the sword and resume the pen. An English contractor for earth-works, who has worked on the railways here, has gone down to Montevideo to see about commencing operations for the new tramways. Verily, Montevideo is going ahead.

We have received rather startling news from Paysandú: a sort of attempted revolution was put down on the 9th inst. by the decision and courage of the able Jefe Politico, Mr. Mundell, without any fuss or nonsense, committing two or three of the ring-leaders into prison. There is a political clique working heaven and earth against Mr. Mundell, but he is respected and esteemed by all foreigners, and we call attention to our correspondents' letter from that quarter, a foreigner who has the real interests of Paysandú at heart. Mr. Mundell is the right man in the right place.

English architects and bricklayers are sadly required in Paysandú, as will be seen by our correspondents' letters. Lopez, Barrios, and Resquin are, according to latest advices, at the Paso de la Patria, where the whole bulk of the Paraguayan army is concentrated. In Humaitá there is only a slender force.

We hear that the troops sent up from this city, per steamer Chacabuco, when landed in front of Obligado behaved in a mutinous manner and deserted in squads. Owing to the boilers heating the men had to be landed for fear of accidents.

To-day the great sheep and ram auction takes place at Nazari's; it promises to be the greatest auction of the season; the animals are some of the finest that have ever been imported into the River Plate.

LATEST FROM PAYSANDU—ATTEMPTED REVOLUTION.

To the Editors of the 'Standard.'

There is nothing particular to notice here, excepting an attempted revolution two days ago against Colonel Mundell, which he put down with great energy and, without any fuss, committing the ringleaders to prison. Your correspondent in Montevideo is very right in supporting Colonel Mundell, and you should induce him to persevere in this course.

I, with all impartiality, must declare that he is a man of strong will, enlightened views, and, as a man of large fortune, free from the petty pilferings and meannesses of public officials generally in the Banda Oriental. It is true nevertheless that he has committed two or three technical blunders in proceeding to do justice in matters not appertaining to his ministry or authority, and his enemies have taken every possible advantage to bring his faults before the eyes of the Government; therefore, in the eyes of the law he is wrong, in those of the public and of common sense he is right.

Yet for all that he is not to blame. He might be more perfect than he is, but his good qualities outweigh immensely his faults, and Paysandú may yet rue the day on which it rejected, like the frog in the fable, the log of wood to ask for a 'stork-king' devisor of his subjects. God save us from 'gachos' and from the authority
