FUNERAL OF DR. KELLOGG.

Montevideo, Jan. 10, 1867.

On Tuesday afternoon we were much shocked to hear of the very sudden death of Dr. Samuel W. Kellogg, Fleet Surgeon of the U. S. squadron in these waters.

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THE COFFIN.

In deposing the remains of Dr. Samuel Wilson Kellogg, chief-surgeon of the U. S. naval-station of Brazil and La Plata, in their last resting-place, I feel it my duty to offer a few words in testimony of this worthy man...

Now the iron road has been laid down. Such surprise is expressed at the conspicuous absence of Brazilian officers from the funeral. It was said the Portuguese were also absent, but the commander of the gumbat Zarco states that he and his officers attended with those of other nations to pay the last honors to the deceased.
