VILLA DE URQUIZA

Buenos Ayres, Jan 30, 1867. To the Editors of the Standard. Gentlemen.

On my visiting a second time the city of Buenos Ayres, in connexion with our church enterprise at Villa de Urquiza, I take the liberty of furnishing a few facts that will be interesting to many of your readers.

Villa de Urquiza is on the bank of the Parana river, six leagues from the city of Paraná. It is a farming colony of about 560 persons, of whom, 100 are natives, 200 European Roman ment of many more American families. The colony is in its infancy, and most of the farmers are poor. During the last few years some of the crops have not been good, and the first houses built by the immigrants have. Mr. James Scully, an Irish estancie- in very few instances, given place to

For one year I have been working in that colony; preaching on the Sunmarks merits the support of all his week days. At the preaching we have.

Occasionally Roman Catholics attend at public service, and at our school we make no restriction as to nationality or religion. For a long time ours has been the only school in the colony, although we receive nothing from the




