MAILS FROM BRAZIL.

THE CHOLERA IN RIO JANEIRO. (FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT). Rio Janeiro, Feb. 15, 1867.

I last wrote you by the transport Texeiras do Freitas which left this port for the River Plate on 9th inst. taking reinforcements to the Brazilian army operating in Paraguay. Some cases of Cholera have appeared here, but at present happily they are very few and the patients were most of them promptly attended to in the Hospital da Misericordia...

The measures taken with regard to the Bank of Brazil do not appear to have produced the effect desired; the credit of the country was suffering, but a want of prudence in applying the remedies has made the case worse than it was before. All kinds of securities have fallen in value; Coffee has not come freely forward to market and the Stock in Rio is small.

It is reported that Mr. Hancock, the representative of Messrs. Brassey & Ogilvie, contractors for the works of the City Improvements Company, whose departure for England per Rhone I advised in my last, has made arrangements with the Brazilian Government for the introduction of 12,000 emigrants who are to have lands and form a colony in the Province of S. Paulo.

By a decree dated 12th inst. the Visconde de Tamandaré was in accordance with his own request, exonerated from the command of the Brazilian Squadron operating in the rivers Paraguay and Paraná, and the same decree complimented him on the important services he had rendered to his country.

On the 14th inst. Mr. Jordan Crewes, for many years the Rio partner of the firm of Messrs. S. Bust & Co., assumed the post of Comptroller in the London and Brazilian Bank. At length the shareholders of this establishment may congratulate themselves on having got the right man in the right place, and feel assured that their interests could not possibly be in more able or experienced hands.

The English Bank of Rio de Janeiro has obtained the permission of the Brazilian Government to establish a branch in Pernambuco. Arrivals of 'Carne sea' this month from the River Plate are 30,795 qtls.
