NEWS FROM EUROPE.

ARRIVAL OF R.M.S. ARNO. The Arno left Rio de Janeiro on the 7th inst., experienced fine weather, and arrived in Montevideo at four o'clock on the 11th, and was placed in quarantine. She left for Buenos Ayres at four o'clock on the 12th inst.

Consols were slightly affected yesterday by the character of the intelligence from Ireland. Quotations are lower. Railways continued much depressed until afternoon, when there was a better feeling, occasioned by the previous sellers buying in to close their accounts.

Lord Lieutenant was discussed at great length. The first proposal was that the address, while deploring the rising, and assuring his Excellency of the loyalty of the Corporation, should declare that the disaffection in the country was owing to bad legislation, and urged that no time should be lost in redressing the grievances of the nation.

In the House of Lords the Eastern question, as revived by the insurrection in Crete, was brought before the House by the Duke of Argyle. That noble peer, while on the whole approving the attitude held by the Foreign Secretary of England on this question, censured the want of humanity shown in the orders he issued to the British Consul not to interfere, even for the purpose of bringing off women and children, fugitives from the island.

In the House of Commons, new writs were moved for the places vacated by Sir John Pakington, Sir Stafford Northcote, and Mr. Corry on taking offices other than those previously held by them.

On the motion for going into committee of supply, a long and interesting debate was begun by Mr. W. E. Forster in reference to the legality of employing volunteers in quelling disturbances in this country.

According to the Englishman, the famine in Orissa is likely to extend over another year, and therefore measures of relief will have to be continued in operation for a long time to come.

AMERICA.

New York, March 7. The public debt has been reduced during the month of February to the extent of 12 millions and a half dollars. The Treasury holds a million and three quarters in gold.

The Virginia Legislature has called a convention for May next to adopt a constitution under the Bill for the military government of the South recently passed by Congress. The negro population propose to call a separate convention.

THE CITY PAVEMENT.

If there is any one subject more than another which commands public attention, and calls for instant action, we hold it is our street pavement. The state of our principal streets is so shocking, the ruts and holes, in even the most fashionable thoroughfares, so break-neck that the unfortunate citizens can neither walk with ease nor ride with safety.

We believe we can safely assert without the fear of contradiction that there is only one properly paved square in the whole of this populous and thriving city, namely, in front of the Cathedral and Archbishop's palace; although in the greatest thoroughfares in town this pavement has now lasted for nearly eight years without even the removal of a single stone.

The Baron de Campy, whose fame eclipses Macadam, and whose imperishable labours in the way of street pavement in Rio stand as monuments of his capacity and skill, has arrived in Buenos Ayres. He it was who in 1859 paved the street before the Cathedral; he is now before the public and offers to pave the whole city on the same plan.

The pavement in front of the Cathedral resembles more the Russ pavement of Broadway, New York, than any other city pavement we know of, and it will no doubt interest our Municipal readers to know that the Russ pavement cost that city no less than six patacons per square yard.

MONTEVIDEO.

Friday 11th 1867. The Plotemy yesterday morning brought us the news per English mail, and was at once put in quarantine: the mortality from cholera and diarrhoea at Rio Janeiro being still four or five daily. At 3 p.m. another English steamer arrived, which proved to be Capt. Harrison's Sylph, from London via St. Vincent in 38 days.

On Wednesday night there were rumors of two cases of cholera, but the papers say not a single case has occurred this week: the mortality list is comparatively low for this season, for it cannot be denied that the weather is very trying to the constitution, being sharp and changeable.

The musical public of the River Plate will learn with regret of the demise of Paul Julien, at Mauritius, in the 28th year of his age. He was one of the best violinists of the age, and took the grand prize at the Conservatoire of Paris when only 9 years old.

The last display of pictures at the Philharmonic, in aid of funds for a German Church, took place last night. This reminds me that Protestant residents complain with much reason of a foolish restriction which prevents the ringing of a bell at the English Church: it was the same in Ireland before the Emancipation, but people are more civilized now than forty years ago.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

The mail steamer Arno arrived early yesterday, and the mails were ashore at ten o'clock. The packet brings a large number of passengers, but very little gold. The English papers are full of accounts about the disturbed state of Ireland.

By private advices from Rio we learn that his Highness the Comte d'Eu has demanded permission to leave for Paraguay. He asks to serve under Caxias. The Cabinet offers every opposition, and it is not supposed that his Highness will be allowed to depart.

A splendid statue of General Lopez, the father of the present President of Paraguay, has just been concluded at Florence. It was ordered by his son, through the Paraguayan agent in England, with the intention of setting it up in Asuncion.

The Italian steamer Venezia, from Corunna, via Teneriffe, has put into Rio for repairs, and will when finished proceed to Buenos Ayres.

The steamer Hallyell left yesterday for Antwerp taking a full complement of cabin passengers, and large cargo. Captain Johnson is one of the most popular commanders trading with the River Plate, and we wish him a pleasant voyage, and hope to see him soon return.

There is a very current rumour that the Paraguayan Minister has passed another note to the U. States Minister, in which Paraguay accepts the mediation, and Barreiro, the agent in Paris, has been ordered to Washington by the packet. We have received the most extraordinary advices from Rio, namely, that orders have been sent to Caxias to conclude an armistice.

CONSUL HUTCHINSON ON THE CHOLERA. In reference to the so-called cholera I beg leave to transmit you a letter that H.B.M.'s Consul, Dr. Hutchinson, addressed to the Ferro-Carril. Dr. Hutchinson is indefatigable in his attendance on the poor, and deserves the highest praise.

Having been requested by some of the respectable inhabitants of Rosario to visit the Cholera Lazaretto here, I have done so on this morning, in company with Dr. Hertz and Mr. Perkins. As I have had very extensive experience of cholera in England, Ireland, and France, and more especially during the epidemic of 1849, when I was medical attendant to the southern part of the Wigan Poor-Law District, it was considered as likely to conduce to the tranquillity of the inhabitants of the city if I were to record my opinion of what I saw.

I am very happy to state that the cholera which exists here need excite no apprehension in the minds of the most timid. A celebrated English pathologist, Dr. Cullen, divides common cholera into two classes. First, Spontaneous Cholera, which is due to meteorological changes, excessive heat, or excessive rain, or rapid transition from one to the other; the second is, Accidental Cholera, caused principally by unripe fruit, or other acid matter, disagreeing with the digestive system.

But not one of the cases which I have seen at the Lazaretto with Dr. Hertz, nor that which I have visited on the Baranca with Dr. Garcia, bear any more resemblance to the malignant, the Asiatic, or the pestilential cholera, than they do to African Elephantiasis or to the Pharenitic (the plague) of Pharaoh.

To obviate the fatal results of this spontaneous cholera which we have in Rosario, and which after all may be said to be only an aggravated form of diarrhoea, I would recommend the administration of external stimulants, such as a cataplasm of spirits of turpentine on flannel to the pit of the stomach, with warm clothing for the body, and the giving of small doses of ammonia, with a little brandy, internally. This, of course, to be only done whilst the doctor is being sent for.
