War inevitable between France and Prussia. The British fleet ordered to Gibraltar. War likely against Spain.

THE ARNO'S MAILS. NINE DAYS LATER FROM EUROPE.

Montevideo, May 13th, 1867. Last night the R.M.S. Arno anchored in port with dates from Rio to the 6th inst.

GREAT BRITAIN. The Reform Bill has passed the second reading, the Government having yielded in reference to the double vote.

Government is resolved to pursue energetically the Tornado question. They have exacted the delivery of the vessel with his Captain and crew, and now demand of Spain satisfaction for the insult.

FRANCE. Grave international complications have arisen out of the German unity and the arrogant attitude assumed by Prussia. Things were gradually looking worse, and a declaration of war was momentarily expected.

ITALY. The new Cabinet is now complete, the retiring members being replaced by Rallazzi, Tschio, Revel, Pesalto Capino, Giovaia, La Deblazio, and Manuelefi.

SPAIN. Government has laid before the Cortes a project of law sanctioning all the acts of the Narvaez Cabinet. Miraflores was named President of the Senate.

PORTUGAL. The utmost quiet prevails throughout the kingdom. A profound sensation was caused by a duel in which a Deputy was killed for maintaining his opinion in the Chambers.

CANDIA. Hopes are entertained of settling the difficulty with the Porte. The Turkish troops have evacuated all their positions in Servia.

UNITED STATES. The Fenian meetings continue, and they openly announce their intention of invading Canada.

In to-day's sitting of the North German Parliament, Herr Von Benningsen rose to question the Government relative to the rumoured cession of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg to France.

MONTEVIDEO. Saturday, 4 P.M.

We are in hourly expectation of the packet, which was due this morning; some attribute her delay to the recent stiff pampero, others surmise she may have been put into quarantine on arrival at Rio Janeiro.

The Leopoldina entered port to-day with dates from Rio to April 23rd, having taken in troops at Sta Catalina. A gentleman who visited the Yaguaripe, the other day, bound for the seat of war, describes the condition of the unfortunate recruits on board as the most disgusting and horrible that can be imagined.

This morning the new church of the Salesas was consecrated. Gen. Flores acted as 'padrino'. There were hardly 100 persons present. The banners of the triple alliance were displayed from the roof, although the Brazilian flag is decidedly objectionable to the people.

The market-buxters made a strike this morning, on account of the prohibition of vegetables, and the place presented quite a bare and dismal appearance.

Some clue has been got to the band of thieves at present carrying on such depredations both here and in Buenos Ayres. The authorities here have telegraphed three times to Sr. Cazon about them, but he has not condescended even to reply.

A shocking outrage has been committed by the authorities of the department of Soriano on an English sheep-farmer named Edward Ward: they stalked him out on the ground. His only offence was having disarmed some drunken fellows on his camp, who afterwards proved to belong to the police!

A GLANCE AT THE FALKLAND ISLANDS AND PATAGONIA.

In the Revista of Buenos Ayres for the month of February we find a most instructive and highly interesting account of the early history of the yet imperfectly known districts of South America.

For more than a century and a half after those events these vast territories were unnoticed by the European States: Spain considered them as merely half-way stations to her Pacific possessions, and as they offered no advantage to commerce or emigration, none but men-of-war, southern traders, or expeditions ever touched their shores.

From this may be dated the first political existence of these regions, and in the voluminous arguments of the rival possessors the future historian will find ample food for the basis of his work.

ARGENTINE COMMERCE. IMPORTS FROM ENGLAND.

The value of merchandize imported last year from England amounted to £1,601,321, or 46 per cent. more than in 1864. A remarkable increase in the trade in textile fabrics has taken place; showing in these articles alone an augmentation of 59 per cent. over the similar imports of the preceding year.
