

Everything was in readiness to make a grand attack on the enemy, by the 15th of May, but the Cholera Morbus broke out on April 26th, at Paso de la Patria, aud in three 'days spread through the whole army with terrible ravages: at Curuzú, no fewer than 4,000 men were prostrated, and of this number 2400 died, including 87 officers. At the same time, 774 Brazilians and 500 Argentines died at Tuyuty. Viscount Port Alegre went about day and night among the sick and dying, and still held his ground at Curuzú, with barely 2,000 men. under the constant fire of the enemy: the fleet also kept up its fire, although decimated by cholera, scurvy and ague.






