ON 'CHANGE.

June 5, 1887. Onnces, \$400. Sovereigns, 1223. National Bonds, 663. There was a very thin attendance on 'Change to-day, and nothing worth doing in any branch of business. Exchange rates at 48, no bills having been passed at a higher rate to-day, but very little as yet done.

NATIONAL BONDS.

This was an exciting day on 'Change. The bears took fright at the firm attitude of the market, and commenced buying right and left to secure their sales at large and very considerable losses; indeed, many think that the losses caused by the recent rise are too heavy for this market. Some two or three well-known parties have left the market in toto, some saying having disposed of their Bonds at low rates, but others insisting that they have not been yet sold; and this afternoon there was an apparent turn in the market, owing to a few brokers selling under hand. There can be no doubt that the bulk of the market has been sold, very few, very few, can resist the temptation of selling out when the prices leave a fair profit. There may be a few, who having bought cheap, hold their Bonds as a regular investment; but they are an exception, and to-day's price is not so fluctuating than anything else. Brokers who have sold out are compelled to buy, but the public, as a rule, hold aloof. Money rules so easy that no one speculates calling loans on bonds for the present. The instant however the money market tightens, all these hypothetical Bonds must be thrown on the market, and it is difficult to say at what price they will touch bottom.
