FOREIGN ITEMS.
The czar just sanctioned an edict banishing dancing-bears from Russia. He allows them five years to get out of the empire.

The Patria announces that a petition from women has been drawn up praying the French Senate to impose a heavy tax upon confirmed bachelors, and adds that it is being "covered with signatures."

The Emperor of Austria has just re-established the Polish language for the study of law at Lemberg. All the examinations will be made in the same language. The telegram announcing this new imperial concession was received with great rejoicing.

Mrs. Lushington, the sister of Alfred Tennyson, once engaged to Arthur Hallam, but now the wife of the Greek Professor of Glasgow, is a remarkable singer, and renders her brother's songs, it is said, with fine expression.

A letter-writer from Edinburgh reports the author of "Hob and his Friends," Dr. John Brown, as still manifesting the effects of a continued illness. "The Country Parson," Mr. A. H. K. Boyd, has removed to St. Andrews, where he has charge of the largest church in the North.

During a recent severe gale in England, an extensive bed of peat, underlying the beach near West Hartlepool, became uncovered, and an immense amount of treasure was found imbedded in the peat. Hundreds of Spanish dollars, some gold rings, and a gold crucifix were picked up. Forty years ago a vessel which had been a Spanish slaver was wrecked near this spot, and it is believed that the treasure was washed out of her, as a good deal of money was found concealed in her timbers.

The Queen of Madagascar has issued an edict forbidding civilians to wear hats with brims. The streets are consequently strewn with the torn off fragments.

The body of the second King of Siam, who died about a year ago, was recently burned with great pomp and ceremony in the presence of some 60,000 persons who had flocked to witness the cremation from all parts of the country. The late monarch was well educated, intelligent, and a good English scholar, though entirely self-taught.

A striking example of the evils of the law of entail is given in the following case:—

The father, the fourth Earl, who died last year, leaving the son was the only heir to the estate, and the son, not being of age, could legally neither give his consent to his being done nor do it himself after his father's death. So, by the operation of the law of primogeniture, the father, with a magnificent estate, could make no provision for his daughters and the son no provision for his sisters. The property passes to an uncle of the late nobleman.

The Bombay papers mention the transmission to England last mail, by letter post, of the celebrated Sancy diamond, through Messrs. Forber & Co. of Bombay. The diamond, was found on the body of Charles the Bold, Duke of Burgundy, after his defeat at Granson, in 1476, by the Swiss. It was purchased in 1479 by the King of Portugal, and ten years later it was sold by him to Nicholas de Bailly, Baron de Sancy, from whom it derives its name. The Baron de Sancy sent it as a present to the King of France, and the servant who had charge of the gift being attacked by robbers, proved himself equal to the occasion, and swallowed the diamond. We must assume that his death speedily followed on this act of devotion, for, according to the story, the stone was found in his body. It afterward came into the possession of James II. of England, by whom it was sold for £25,000 to Louis XIV. During the French Revolution the Sancy diamond, as well as the more celebrated Blue diamond, disappeared. The latter has never been recovered, but the former was purchased by Napoleon I., by whom it was afterward sold to Prince Paul Demidoff. It is valued at from £20,000 to £30,000, is pear-shaped, and weighs 53½ carats.

National Bonds 555

National Bonds gave way to-day, contrary to the expectation of the bulls. The bonds which matured, although at once taken up, were not bought on the market, and Bonds were far more abundant than the bulls expected. The real price of Bonds for the amortization depends on the capability of one or two noted buyers to carry their securities. The vicinities for the end of the month are to be calculated in millions; in fact, no such amount of Bonds as that sold in the control of the brokers. But it is absolutely impossible to offer an opinion as to the price, the market is surrounded with so many contingencies. Paper money is very abundant, and gold is each day coming into greater demand.

To-day Exchange on England was done at 49, a rate unprecedented in the commercial annals of the country. Shipping gold now and drawing against the remittance is a legitimate business, and gives fair profits; and as to the passing of the bills there can be little difficulty, since even the bill of lading can be attached. The order now of stopping the saladeros, at the very busiest moment, is patent. There is nothing left to ship save a few half-pipes of sheep grease and shales.

The export trade of the River Plata, may be said to be a complete standstill, and, as a natural consequence, specie must be shipped. The total amount of gold exported up to the present is about £310,000 sterling in equivalent. Possibly there may be in the Plata six or seven hundred thousand sovereigns still, but if the shipments go on as they are at present, in two months more there will be no more English gold in the Plata, and the withdrawal of so large an amount as five millions of pounds from this market so suddenly, must necessarily cause consequent depression of the most serious nature. Thus whilst brokers and speculators are going into the black at the late prices of Bonds, merchants look aloof and keep their eyes fixed on the Exchange market. The Provincial Bank is now impotent to stem the current. They might have drawn at 48½ last packet, but now it is too late, and in proportion as the premium on sovereigns goes up the rate of Exchange falls. Brazilian gold is very abundant, but at present rates leaves a loss on shipment; it, however, the rate still falls, it is possible that Brazilian gold will come into demand for export purposes.

By telegraph to-day we learn of another shipwreck, the Marzanita Palmaro, from Cetto, consigned to Messrs. Andrin & Co., has gone down at the mouth of the river. Half the crew perished. The steamer Donati, a fine new vessel of the Astronomical line, is expected in a few days. In Exchange on France the rate ruled at 67 to 5.11.
