IRELAND AFTER TEN YEARS' ABSENCE. Carlow, Dec. 16th

I left London on the 4th, in the midst of the cab-strike (having to pay handsomely for a vehicle to the station): the whole country was white with frost, and the train had to slacken its speed at intervals as the rails were rather slippery.

IMPORTANT FROM MONTEVIDEO

We have received files of the Montevideo papers, and extract the following:— The Dutch barque Gertrudis, from Rotterdam to Buenos Ayres, has procured a complete wreck, and gone to pieces at a place called Punta Carreta.

No editor, on the part of the Government, has been found necessary to stop the saladeros, since the peones, all of their own accord, clear out, the number of animals killed last month is put down at 9,407; and, in fact, from what is now evident, the 'faena' this year will be probably the smallest ever known in the Plate.

During the past week the increased mortality has caused nothing short of alarm, and it has been remarked that the bulk of the people dying are French. This is attributed to their great love of fruit, vegetables and salad at this most dangerous season.

Proposals for the building of new Customs deposits have been called for. The want of large bonded warehouses is greatly felt. Some merchants complain of the greatest difficulty in finding deposit room for the goods, arriving. There have been instances known of merchants despatching their goods and obliged to deposit them in their bedrooms.

We have had some very severe stormy weather for the last ten days, with terrific rains. The camps in low places are floated, and the arroyos are turned to rivers.

A large quantity of wheat yet at the mercy of the weather. Much of it will be entirely lost. A large trade is going on here in baling alfalfa for the army.

I trust my next letter may be of a more cheering character. At present all looks dark and gloomy.

TERRIBLE NEWS FROM SALADILLO

FIVE HUNDRED SHEEP DIED OFF. Saladillo, January 20, 1868.

Nothing is talked of here but the cholera, and the most absurd and extravagant stories are told of its ravages and cause.

The lower class have got into their heads that the cholera is a poison, in the shape of different coloured powders, and introduced by foreigners.

Of course, no mere chaffs dare show themselves about here at present, not a great loss, unless to such pueteros and peones who, by robbing their masters of skins, grease, horsehair, &c., enrich these perambulating cheats, who pay for these articles whatever they please, or take them as payment for some of their own trash.

There is a rancho, not far from where I am living (Partido 25 de Mayo), in which all the inmates are supposed to be dead or dying, no one being courageous enough to explore this abode of death any further than to let go a horse who was dying at the palenque.

A plague has likewise broken out in two flocks of sheep, 500 having died in one day. The sheep have had abundance of grass and water all through the drought. What is most remarkable is this, that the neighbours whose sheep are feeding on the same run have not lost an animal as yet.

LAS FLORES

We have had a few cases of cholera in this partido but not near the number report gives circulation to; up to this moment there are only eight cases officially reported to the Juzgado; one of these was a bullock cart driver, another was a capon buyer, a third was a mercachiflo lately arrived from town, the others were the owners of the houses wherein these parties died.

usual. On the 15th inst. two men were brought in prisoners, and condemned to fifteen days hard labour; their crime is new to the penal Code of this country, it may be summed up as follows:—an alcalde went to Mr. Van Praet's estancia and ordered these men (the prisoners) to bury the Corpse of a man who had died of cholera thirty six hours previously; the men refused stating that they dreaded cholera too much to approach a corpse already in a state of decomposition, and in consequence of this refusal they were imprisoned. This act tramples on the Constitution of the State and scatters the contents of its 14th article to the four winds of Heaven.

If our justice of peace is determined to convert this partido into an Argentine Poland he is better declare his intention at once so that the inhabitants native and foreign may have time to remove to other districts where the laws are interpreted with more equity.

The people here are all crying out for a lazaret, but the justice of peace says no—and who dare say against him? This functionary is determined to spend no money: a temporary lazaret could be put up in one of the chaclas distant from the town and supplied with beds and bedding for five thousand paper dollars.

There has been an order issued to bury every person who dies in the camp—that is, outside the radius of this town—in the vicinity wherein he dies.

One of the alcaldes sent in for some coffins and a quantity of lime to have ready in case of need, stating that he would charge those who had the means of paying for the Coffins but the Judge refused point blank to send either Coffins or lime.

TERRIBLE NEWS FROM THE FORTIN DE ARECO

January 12, 1868.

Things are as bad in the camp as in town, and men are frightened out of their senses getting intoxicated with fear, and flying to where they know not: those that are living are prostrated in body and mind.

The atmosphere for days past is of a dry, fiery nature, exhausting and prostrating the energy of the system. During the many years I have resided in the country, never have I beheld the scenes that are being witnessed at present. Surely this dreadful Paraguayan war should be brought to a termination, for to it everybody in the camp attributes the present disease and the otherwise gloomy prospect of affairs.

Where I am living (Partido 25 de Mayo), in which all the inmates are supposed to be dead or dying, no one being courageous enough to explore this abode of death any further than to let go a horse who was dying at the palenque.

We have no sanitary commission, medical assistance, or even authority competent or willing to stretch forth a helping hand to the poor in this hour of need, and this is, perhaps, only one of many similar cases.

In any other country an investigation would at once be held to find out the cause of such a fearful mortality amongst live stock, and, if necessary, precautions taken against the spreading of the disease; but how could such a thing be expected in this highly civilized Republic, where human bodies are left unburied in the open camp, sewed up in horse-hides.

Something must be wrong, when a man can descend from the exalted position of Sr. Rodriguez, to the humble one of taking destination by the hand at a pleasure meeting, and behold them on the following day in the midst of their wretchedness, without succour or the hope of assistance, and while knowing this to be the fact, squander the Municipal funds to the amount of twelve or fourteen thousand dollars on an entertainment, under the name of christening the school. Had you had these men in town at the late Municipal blockade, you would have brought them to their senses, and yet it is said that Rodriguez, as Judge and Municipal President, is 'the right man in the right place.'
