Since I wrote last the cholera has been steadily declining, and has now entirely disappeared from the city, except, perhaps, a few cases of persons who have been very sick, and have not recovered yet. It is still raging in some parts of the camp, but where it first commenced it is now declining. It is very bad the other side of the Sierra, and appears to be extending all over the Upper Provinces.

Dr. Luque has been quite sick with the prevailing epidemic, brought on most likely by fatigue, a sister of his having died, and several members of his family sick. He is now, however, quite well again, and ready for useful-


