ORIENTAL REPUBLIC. The event which by anticipation has kept the sister Republic for a engthened period in a disturbed state, and led to such tragic events, is now t ' fait accompli.'

On Sunday, the 1st of March, the conclave for the election of President met, Col. Bustamante presiding. Of the three names who stood foremost n the list of candidates at the begining of the previous week-Varela, Bustamente, and Suarez-the first liscovered and confessed that his age lisqualified him from aspiring to the nonors of the first magistracy of the Republic, the second voluntarily withlrew, and everything led one to beieve that the third would have a walk over, when lo and behold! a new name is set up at the eleventh hour. The respectable portion of public opinion rallies round him, and he regeives an equal number of votes with his opponent. The casting vote of the chairman, Col. Bustamante, however, decides in his favor, and General Batlle is proclaimed the constitutional

President of the Oriental Republic. Gen. Battle began his political cawas Minister of War during the nine years siege of Montevideo, a post which he again occupied during Gen. Flores's dictatorship; and has ever been favorably known to the public as a man of sound good sense, moderate views, and honest purpose.

He bears therefore in this respect a favorable contrast to Gen. Suarez, whose tendencies were fatally exhibited in the tragical and treacherous execution, of the heroic defender of Paysandu, the unfortunate Leandro

Although public opinion therefore has pronounced itself well pleased with the result of last Sunday's election, it is impossible not to anticipate that the baffled aspirations of a man of Suarez's character and influence will not rest satisfied with being defeated by one single vote.

"Civil war," says Sarmiento, "owes ts origin to the fact that its abettors wilfully ignore that a government must be the result of the thinking majority." A great truth, but one which is too often lost sight of by our statesmen.

Were our political parties to look for a propaganda of their creed in the force of arguments, and not, as we are bound to witness every day, in violence corruption, or foreign intervention, the prospects of these countries would take a change for the better, and only when such an order of things prevails will they be able to refute successfully the charge of being semi-barbarous nations, ruled by ephemeral governments."

It is not the province of foreigners to discuss the merits or demerits of the two parties which are so ruthlessly pitted against each other in the neighboring Republic. But impartial observers must confess that if the cowardly assassination of Gen. Flores throws an indelible stain on the Blancos, to whom is popularly imputed this crime, the execution of Berro and the wholesale massacres that followed cast scarcely less opprobium on their authors and accom-

One thing is certain, that late events cannot but have widened the breach that separated the two parties, and given rise to a recrudency to feelings of bloodthirsty revenge, which the mild rule of Flores to a certain extent had assuaged. And unless General Suarez can display a greater amount of magnanimity than he has hitherto had credit for, it is not improbable that further complications may supervene by an irreparable split between the Suarists and the rest of the Colorado party.

The most casual observer cannot ail to remark how admirably such a state of things would second the ambitious views of any foreign power bent on annexation, since by aiding one party it could successfully crush the others, and thus that favored region would fall an easy prey into its




