In Bonds no disposition to buy, only sales 17,200 each, at 41, 5,000 for 31st March, at 61. The market looks weak. Some difficulty is expected in obtaining money to withdraw funds on the 31st inst. The hours predict that Bonds must fall considerably.

Exchange flatter, and will probably close weak, yet this, merchants opine, is merely to assist in enabling drawers to pass large amounts at packet at a moderate rate, say below 40d. It must be borne in mind that sales from the 1st of the month have been very limited. Thus future remittances cannot be very large; the rate in May ought therefore to be higher than at present. On France, 5-8 does better, for drawers above.

The saladeristas continue making contracts for pickled cattle at 150 dollars a ton, for delivery up to the 15th June next. The season promises to be both heavy and late. Money continues in active demand, principally for Exchange purposes. Good city paper still in preference to other documents at higher rates.

The French steamer Aunis brought the Maua Bank 425,000 in gold. An arrival of some fine wools from Magdalena, Ensenada, and Cabaleta, attracted great attention; good prices obtained. They were sold from 72 to 82. Inferior classes rather low and dull, from 36 to 60.

Dry Hides—Very important sales this week: prices from 110, 120, to 130 per pesada. Few arrivals. Sheepskins—Sales difficult. Good mataderos fetch 130, inferior classes from 70 up. Horse Hides readily sold. Good ones 30 each, inferior 20.

Horse Hair readily sold. Good lots from the South at 90 to 150. Grasse and Tallow—In borderlands 15lbs, and in panza from 22 to 30. Capones—Inferiors, sold at Barracas, 15 each. Corn—Sold at the Station at 138 per fanega.

Nothing done in National Bonds, no buyers. Sellers are not willing to sacrifice their Bonds at the prices offered. Business generally continues active. Almacenes are doing a sound business. Importers of dry goods have of late been selling largely at fair prices.

Exchange flat; drawers at 481 and 6.08. Not much doing. The bulk of Exchange already passed. Discounts active. Good first-class paper easily done. Monday is generally a dull day on the Bolas, and the attendance of merchants was not large. Much disappointment was expressed at the indefinite nature of the news from the seat of war. 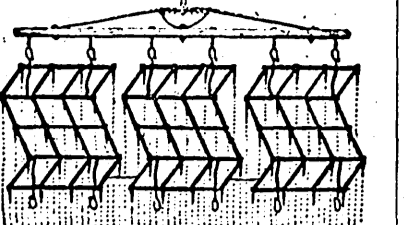
