It was necessary to show that these were not mere theorists, enthusiasts, or epicures desirous only to cultivate a new sensation. So what is called a "bauquet hippophagique" was given at the Langham Hotel last night, and over 160 gentlemen were invited to partake of it. You may convince vourself more or less completely that you ought to eat horseflesh without feeling squeamish. Can you compose the stomach and banish all qualms by force of reason? This was the experiment which at the cost of a guinea and a half was tried last evening. 


