SAD NEWS FROM CHIVILCOY

Chivilcoy, Jan. 31, 1867. To the Editors of the "Standard," Gentlemen,

A countryman of ours named Patrick Dowd, living close to the Estacion Gorostiaga, took sick on Wednesday, 22nd instant, about one or two o'clock, p.m., and died about nine o'clock the same night. There were two Irishmen in the house with him at the time, one as soon, the other stopping in the house for some 15 days, waiting to receive a flock of sheep from Mr. Dowd, to mind in a separate puesto.

The dust storm on Saturday and the rain on Sunday morning had scattered the flock, and I may safely say that from the railway at Gorostiaga along the coast of the Saladas on to the Cañada Rica, until entering the partido of Navarro, a distance of seven leagues, almost all the sheep have been driven past the railway through the chacras of Chivilcoy, on Dr. Gorostiaga's camp, and I think as far as Chacabuco.

Poor Dowd has a father in Ireland. I believe he has an uncle, Michael Dowd, in this country, besides an aunt. At other times the British Consul would look after the property, but I despair.

The line of camp I have mentioned between here and Cañada Rica is a howling wilderness and vast cemetery.

P.S.—As I concluded this, your impression of the 30th inst. came to hand, where I see published the deaths of some intimate acquaintances. Let us pray a tear to their memory, and drop God to have mercy on them, and beg of Him to fit and prepare us all for that awful hour which stares us in the face.

TO THE MEMORY OF THE VERY REV. FATHER TOMAS DE LOS SANTOS. The community here has been deeply distressed by the lamented death of the very Rev. Father Thomas de los Santos, which took place in the city of Cordova, on the 17th ult.

We cannot do adequate justice in the limited space at our disposal to the memory of this distinguished member of the church. In the midst of the great afflictions and horrors that raged in Mendoza at the time of the earthquake he dedicated himself to the service of the unhappy victims of the dread calamity founding hospitals in which he himself attended them with paternal care, distributing bread and meat to the sufferers.

THE ISLAND OF ST. THOMAS.

(Extract of letter from a friend at St. Thomas, dated Nov. 30, '67.) We have had an awful time of it since I last wrote you. I can hardly describe my feelings at the time. In a month or so we will look at it with less horror; but up to now many people cannot return to their business occupations. The night of the 18th I spent on the bare rocks, only glad if security could be had there. At each shock I held on by a tree. The cries of the poor distracted people added horror to the scene. The next day we got counterpanes over us, and the day following a regular tent, where we staid the week out. I ventured to my house (also on a hill, but not so high), to dress and have a bath; while bathing a severe shock came and with a high stone house overtopping me on the other side of the street, you may suppose I did not feel comfortable, Nothing but God's mercy saved us. How the town was not destroyed, no one can tell—a few seconds more might have done it. Such a scene I hope never to witness again; order no longer ruled in the town, and there was much plundering. Military and police all fled.

On Sunday, the 21st, many thousands met in the Paix de Grand, to join with their pastors in giving thanks to God. The scene was very picturesque, and I hope will be of lasting good. It is now all over, I trust, and our town has resumed some of its happy quietude.

BOARD OF TRADE REPORT NOV., 1867.

The Board of Trade returns for the past month show a falling off of £1,046,782, or about 6 per cent., in the declared value of our exports compared with the corresponding month of last year. As against the same month of 1865, however, they show an increase of 2 per cent. Much of the reduction from last year is due to the decline in the price of the cotton and not to any diminution in the industry of the country, our shipments of cotton goods having been of 8 per cent less money value than in October 1866, although in their quantity there was an increase of 1 1/2 per cent. Of cotton yarn the value of our shipment was only fractionally greater than in October of last year, while in quantity they experienced an augmentation of 16 per cent. As regards most other branches of business these returns indicate much dulness, iron manufacturers, which show an increase of 13 per cent., again forming the most prominent exception. There has been a decrease of 3 per cent. in shipments of earthenware, of 10 per cent. in haberdashery, 9 per cent. in hardware, and six per cent. in silk manufactures.

Line manufactures also figure for a falling off of 22 per cent. in value, and 17 per cent. in quantity. In the exportation of woollen yarns there has been an increase of 10 per cent. in value, but those of woollen manufactures show a diminution of 19 per cent. in value and 22 per cent. in quantity. With regard to the importations of the month it appears that the arrivals of cotton were 839,317 cwt., against 819,957 cwt. last year. Of wheat there were 1,874,854 cwt., against 1,830,560 cwt. last year, increase about 60 per cent. and more than half the entire total was obtained from Russia. From the United States the proportion was about 15 per cent., the quantity having been 444,460 cwt., against only 52,280 cwt. in October, 1866.

The value of the exports of the produce and manufactures of the United Kingdom for the first 10 months of the present year has been £153,051,630, showing a reduction of over 3 1/2 per cent. from the total of the corresponding period of last year, which was the largest ever attained. Making allowance for the extent to which the prices of raw material have been reduced, the total of the present year, although nominally rather lower than that of 1866, may be considered to represent a greater amount of actual trade than has been witnessed at any former period.

THE MORMON TEMPLE.

Somebody who describes the Mormon temple at Salt Lake, now nearly complete, compares its appearance to that of an old-fashioned ship, without any keel, turned bottom up. The roof is supported by forty-four piers of cut sandstone, each nine feet by three. The interior of the building is thus described:—"The stand for the speakers is at the west end of the building, and covers seventy-five hundred feet of surface. The form of the stand is the segment of a circle. Before it are a seat and desks for the bishops and others who administer the sacrament. The first seat in the centre of the stand or platform is for the President of the State, the next for the Quorum of the Twelve, the third for the First President. Back of these are seats for a choir of one hundred and fifty singers, with the great organ, yet unfinished, behind them. On the right and left are seats for from eight hundred to one thousand persons. The speaker's desk is sixty feet in front of the western piers. In front of the stand, for seventy feet, the floor is horizontal, thence to the east end the floor rises with a grade of one foot in ten. The room will seat between eight and nine thousand persons.

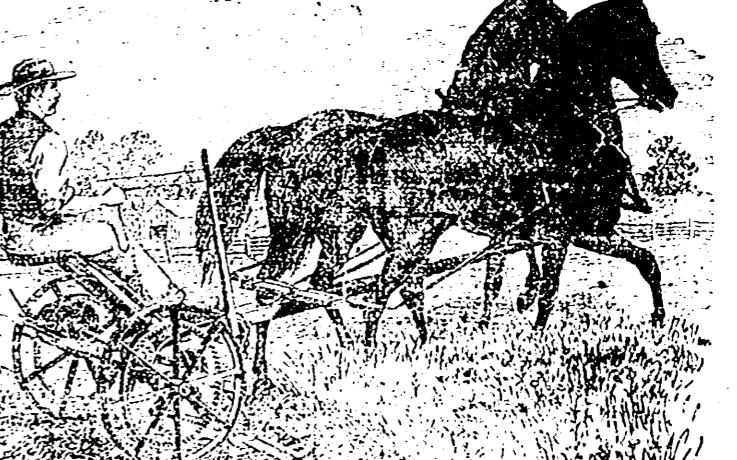
