

STATE OF LIVERPOOL.

The retrograde policy of the United States is one among several causes that have militated adversely to Liverpool interests. The falling-off in exports to America represents fully onehalf the total loss on the year. But just let us glance at the trade of Liverpool as indicated in the value of the goods exported from the Mersey. In 1865 their value was seventy-three millions sterling; in 1866 the figures rose to eighty-seven millions; and, had the same ratio of progress been maintained, as, judging from the analogy of former years, was reasonably possible, the splendid aggregate of a hundred millions would have been attained. It has been judicially decided that this Act applies to an involuntary proceeding or accident as well as to a wilful viol ation of the provisions of the Act The Barnsley Gas Company having ascertained and admitted that the offence had been committed accidentally by some of their servants, have been met in a liberal spirit by the we hear that all proceedings to enforce the £200 penalty have been withdrawn on the company paying £20 and the costs incurred. By arrangement the above sum has been this week paid to the Beckett Dispensary, one of the most useful of the Barnsley charities. We give publicity to these facts as a warning to all gas companies, their officials, and servants, and we cannot too strongly impress upon the public also the great and growing necessity for keeping all our public streams as free from pollution as possible.—Sheffield Daily Telegraph.


