#### THE IMPEACHMENT OF THE PRESIDENT.

It may not be generally known to our readers that the most active preparations for the impeachment of President Mitre at the next session of Congress are going on. Five of the principal lawyers of this city have been bill of attainder is already drawn up. It is almost needless to say that the crimes against the Constitution, and almost exclusively refer to the late revolution in some of the Provin-

It must, of course, be a matter of regret to all that an administration which began under the brightest and sunniest auspices, should terminate with an act of attainder against the Chief Magistrate. Better this, however, than riot and confusion; and it is a glorious assertion of the supremacy of the law, of the stability of institutions of the country, and of the genuine patriotism of the President to find that such charges are adjudicated by congress and the Federal Court instead of, as in former years, by revolution and civil strife.

We shall not now enter into a consideration of the merits of the case, nor defend President Mitre against the charges in the indictment, but we insist that the example he sets his countrymen in bowing to the law of the land, even though armed with the elements of resistance, in stepping from the Presidential chair to the bar of Congress, to answer an arraignment promoted by party faction, will secure for his cause a public sympathy which possibly his political errors have long since forfeited.




