THE IMPEACHMENT OF THE PRESIDENT.

It may not be generally known to our readers that the most active preparations for the impeachment of President Mitre at the next session of Congress are going on.

It must, of course, be a matter of regret to all that an administration which began under the brightest and sunniest auspices, should terminate with an act of attainder against the Chief Magistrate.

We shall not now enter into a consideration of the merits of the case, nor defend President Mitre against the charges in the indictment, but we insist that the example he sets his countrymen in bowing to the law of the land, even though armed with the elements of resistance, in stepping from the Presidential chair to the bar of Congress, to answer an arraignment promoted by party faction, will secure for his cause a public sympathy which possibly his political errors have long since forfeited.

The iniquitous revolution in Santa Fé, the unjustifiable revolts in other provinces, are matters of too high an importance to be passed over with impunity in any country that lays claim to a constitutional Government and liberal institutions; we respect therefore the motives which have induced this impeachment, and we esteem the men, no matter to what party or faction they may belong, who drag before the proper authorities the magistrate whom they believe to be delinquent.

Viewed in this light, the impeachment of the President is a consoling evidence of the declining spirit of civil war, and the rapid increase of Republicanism. It is, beyond all question, a proof of a salutary improvement in the social and moral condition of the country.

One of the greatest evils this country has had to contend with has been a corrupt, servile pliancy to the executive. The opinion of the community, no matter how pronounced or ascertained, hitherto weighed as nothing against the will of a minister or the dictates of a ruler, but happily the hour has arrived when the conduct of those who administer public affairs are amenable to law, and, no matter how this impeachment suit may result, it must be productive of much good, since it will prove a lesson to future rulers in these countries.

We have no hesitation whatsoever in saying that the more we look into the question and investigate the charges against the President, the less probability do we see of a conviction. It is all very well to lay the present lamentable state of Santa Fé before Congress, to picture the wreck and ruin which the recent revolutions have caused, to follow, step by step, the history of these disgraceful revolts, the unguarded conduct of the National Commissioner, and the great partiality which he betrayed towards the rebels.

No matter what the private sympathies of the President may be, his public acts are only those which can be the subject of an indictment; and doubtless when he is brought to the bar of the house he will assert all this; and furthermore, that the only real accusation against him is a sort of public censure for acts over which he had no control.

But each mail from the Interior brings us such gloomy intelligence of revolts and revolutions, caused by scheming political agents and electioneering commissioners, that it is by no means improbable the present bill of indictment against the President will be considerably enlarged before the trial takes place.

On some future occasion we shall endeavour to give a short insight into the American law on the question. Neither the English Common Law nor Statute Law bear on the subject; and Kent and Story must decide the fate of the President.

ROSARIO.

[FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT.] April 16, 1868. The delicious autumn time is upon us, and after the very 'severe summer,' as the Rev. Sidney Smith used to remark, the cool pampers that are so general are a great blessing.

I am tired of writing about Indian invasions. It seems that the savages do not even give themselves the trouble to return to their 'tolderies' after an excursion. The road between Villanueva and Mendoza may be said to be in their hands.

The steam plough of Mr. Melrose has gone up in a special train. It was put together here before going out. Now the question is to see how it will work—that is, if it be economical—that is the only doubt that can exist. There is a description of gang-plough much in use in the States, which would admirably suit this country.

The letter of Mr. Leemith that you published in the Standard has drawn considerable attention towards the system of agriculture in use on the prairie lands of the great west. I have got the breaking-plough ordered, as well as a quantity of Osago orange seed for fencing.

The latest news from the Californian Colony is very satisfactory as far as the situation of the farmers is concerned; but there are fears of the Indians, and I have addressed notes to both the National and Provincial Governments in reference to the necessity of strengthening the fort at San Javier with a few good men.

The Salta and Tucuman contingents all the horses they required, went off towards Frayle Muerto. Here they laid the town under contribution, and killed the comandante. They sent two of their party to Villa Nueva to get money in their name, but the authorities there put the fellows in jail.

The intelligence from Peru we publish in another column is highly interesting, and we call the attention of our readers to its harrowing details. The Montevidean papers announce the arrival there of a child eight years old, who is said to be a prodigy on the piano.

Yesterday two more locomotives for

the Great Central were landed at the company's wharves. They are wanted, as the traffic has increased to such an extent that the rolling stock had become too limited for the work to be done.

The new Governor has ordered elections for deputies for the Provincial Chambers. I notice that Dr. Perez has been eliminated from his post as deputy because he accepted the position of Gefé Politico during the late troubles.

The elections for electors for President took place on Sunday. There was no opposition of any kind; the Federals had it their own way. Not one single Liberal presented himself at the polls.

The contents of a letter published in the "Standard," and signed by "Astor," have somewhat shocked me. I do not think that the English population in Rosario has any reason to complain of Mr. Consul Hutchinson.

I can understand that in the case referred to by "Astor" the writer has been interested, probably a relative, and is consequently hardly impartial enough to judge the case. My personal opinion in reference to the fate of poor Mr. Douglas it is useless to give.

We received yesterday our usual exchanges from Montevideo. The questions of the banks and the Argentine Presidential election are the subjects that principally attract the attention of the public press in our sister city.

We read in the "Siglo" of Montevideo:—"The Commercial Bank declares that it is in a position to exchange its notes for gold before the expiration of the period fixed for the suspension of specie payments."

Opera-goers will be glad to hear that the long expected Ferrari, minus the complete company, has arrived in the Savoie. Mr. Ferrari has succeeded in procuring a prima-donna, a tenor, and a baritone, which will at least form the nucleus of a new company.

We were favored a day or two ago with a visit from Mr. Martin McKenny of the Californian Colony, in the Gran Chaco, Province of Santa Fé, which is in a promising condition. The
