LATEST FROM MONTEVIDEO. Monteideo, April 20, 1868. Three P.M.

Great rain on Sunday night. It is feared the races will prove a failure, many having refrained from going owing to the weather.

Elections on Sunday at the churches for Junta. Some apprehended a row, but Government took every precaution and they passed off quietly.

The Brownlow arrived this morning from Buenos Ayres: she brought no gold.

To-day is a holiday by decree: no business doing.

The Rio Uruguay, on Sunday morning, brought a number of English passengers, supposed to be for the races.

Mr. Rom, of the Bolsa, arrived. It is said he has come to study paper money. To-day gone to the race-course.

The San Paulo leaves to-night for Rio, taking mails.

Steamer Georgia Belle sold by Iglesias to Concepcion for £16,000, to take coal to Curupaity.

Gold, 11 per cent. premium. Five hundred thousand sovereigns coming from Rio for the Mauá Bank.

Specie payment question still the leading topic. It goes before the Chambers. The general impression is that it will be extended.

Mr. Ure Mackinlay, formerly manager at Messrs. Bates & Stokes, sails from Rio for Europe in the French Admiral's flagship Magicienne.

The Tasmania, from London, supposed to have been lost with printing-paper for Standard, has arrived.

Banks all closed to-day; Bolsa also. An English and American firm

failed within the last few days. Liabilities heavy, assets light; chiefly in ship chandlery and grocery line.

The Gleaner was sold to Mr. Keegan for £876. She is to be fitted with living apparatus, for salvage purposes, and to ply on the rivers looking up wrecks.

A new joint-stock company is talked of to supply Montevideo and Buenos Ayres with fresh oysters from Maldonado.

There is much excitement here about the Presidential election. The general supposition is that Dr. Rawson will be the man.

THE "TIMES" ON INTERVENTION.

We reprint elsewhere an article on the war in Paraguay, from the London Times. The opinions of that paper are the daily reflex of the whims of the moneyed interest; and if its political prophecies are not always very happy, the superiority of its information makes it still an authority with the English public.

It is suggested that the intervention be a joint one by Great Britain and the United States. The latter Power is the self-constituted protector of South American Republics; and to some extent it has a natural right to be so.

However anxious we may be here, to see the end of that pardonable political blunder, the Paraguayan war, it is doubtful if general opinion would ratify the notion of the Times that the liberation of British subjects and the close of the war should be made the object of one and the same negotiation.

If intervention with the object of bringing the war to a close, is in future thought to be necessary in the cause of humanity, it had better be left to the Unit d States alone, and allow that Power the exclusive honor such interference would entail, as well as the abuse that will, sooner or later, follow from one or other party, or one of other side.

THE WAR IN THE NORTH.

We are just come in from Curupaity after a sojourn there since the 8th. During the interval little worthy of note has taken place in that quarter. Late in the evening of the 10th a few heavy guns were fired at the fortress from the new works the allies are forming at long ranges to the westwards of Humaita.

It is but a few days since the allies began to move from the camps of Itapiru, Tuyuty, and Tuyucú. Now, the shores of the River Paraguay are covered with a busy throng, pontoons, masses of stores, huge piles of hay, for the most part worthless, new shanties going up at every place.

The steamer which arrived yesterday from Rosario brought no news of particular interest, but there are two facts which become more and more evident. The reduction of the fortress of Humaita is likely to be a tedious business of itself, as the garrison is stronger than the Brazilian Commander-in-Chief anticipated; yet the taking of Humaita must, according to general notions precede any serious operations in the interior.

A deputation of landed and house proprietors waited on the Provincial Government on Saturday last to complain of the high valuations which had been put on real property by the assessors of the Contribution Directa; and also to represent to the Government that the period fixed for appeal to a jury against unfair valuations was too short.

Talavera, and our esteemed colleague must excuse us, if the facility with which it has lent itself to publish unfounded accusations against persons in high station, who did not subscribe to its political creed, makes us look with considerable scepticism, on the correctness of its informant in the present case.

Mr. Mohr, of Salto, who has until lately so satisfactorily performed the onerous duties of our agent in that locality, informs us that his business engagements will not permit him in future to continue in the agency, of which the Post Master of that town, Sr. Leon Abilés has now kindly taken charge.

BELGRANO RACES.

APRIL 19th 1868. The loveliness of the day, and the object to which the proceeds of the meeting of last Sunday were destined, attracted a large concourse of people on the Belgrano race-course.

The Manager of the Northern Railway resolved to put on an extra train for the occasion, to start at 12 o'clock, which was not generally known, as we ourselves received no notice of it, although some of our contemporaries were more fortunate, and yet an enormous crowd filled the cars of the railway by that and the next train.

A very large number of carriages from town filled the enclosure, and most of its occupants sought, in the cool shade of the grand stand, shelter from the somewhat incommensurate rays of the sun.

The first race was the Carrera Argentina. For saddle horses. Entry \$100, with \$500 added. Once round. Weight, 150lbs.

The second race was the Carrera Estimulo. Entry \$500, with \$2000 added. Once round. Weight, 150lbs.

The third race was the Carrera Velocidad. Entry, \$300, with \$2,000 added. Half round; weight, 150lb.

This was the great event of the day, ending in the unexpected defeat of the favorite. The Bayo is known to be a very fast horse in the half round, and, as the Ruano was an unknown horse, five to three, and five to two, were freely given on the Goloso against the field, his owners backing him freely at the last odds, although his very poor condition, compared to the Ruano, a compact little horse in splendid trim, ought to have made them more cautious.

SHEEPFARMERS, TAXES, LANDLORDS, AND SOLE. To the Editors of the "Standard." Gentlemen, We, sheepfarmers, Messrs. Editors, are about as unreasonable a set of fellows as any lot of 'foregatherers' or old women, who wish black-puddings would tumble down the chimney, ready

cooked, and hop on to, their plates, or into their open mouths. We are everlastingly grumbling at and blaming everything and everybody but ourselves, and our own proceedings, for the consequences which they entail.

"Shure, and we are ruined entirely by the taxes; it is come to a purty pass when they puts the tax on the sheepfarmers; shure wool would be worth \$100 the ar., and sheep \$40 or \$50, only for the tax." "Bedad, but it's the landlords, man, you'd have wool and sheep up if the squeezing landlords didn't take the big rent from ye."

In a public room one can't altogether ignore the next table. There sat a merchant's shipping clerk, with a depressed air, and a Bradford man, doing cocktails, too; knowingly knocking glasses, the touchingly interchanging sentiments.

As you may be sure, Messrs. Editors, I riled at this, and felt gone to 'trail my coat,' and may be I would have done so, only I saw a grim United States man looking terrific at me from across the table; this fairly split my ire in two, so I subsided, thinking that it would have been bad to have the two sides of the Atlantic close in on me.

A fourth table had also risen to pay shot at the table. The paymaster of this mess, a tidy dapper little fellow, as he turned from the counter, carefully dusting cigar-ash off his clothes with a Glasgow handkerchief, dolefully remarked to his companion—"I want a new coat badly, can't afford tho', cloth too dear; if now it could be got down 30 to 50 per cent. we poor fellows could have two suits a year instead of one—but such is life. Those greedy sheepfarmers, merchants, manufacturers, &c., all get fat, while we poor devils go bare and greasy."

It has been for a long time confidently anticipated that the war would be ended by the utter exhaustion of Paraguay. General Lopez is reported to have lost four-fifths of his forces, and his present troops, consisting in a great measure of mere boys and worn out veterans and invalids, are exposed to the direst privations.

The correspondence respecting hostilities in the River Plate, lately laid before Parliament, and embracing the period between May and December of last year, not only throws some light on a subject upon which we were hitherto almost completely in the dark, but opens up a question of no slight importance for this country.

Paraguay, maintained that these British subjects had entered voluntarily into the service of the Paraguayan Government, and had expressed no wish to quit it. He pleaded further, that by all the usages of war, and by the peculiar difficulties of his position, he considered himself entitled to forbid the departure of any foreigner from his dominions, closely beset as he was on all sides by his enemies; and that he had for the same reasons extended the same prohibition to some citizens of the United States, who had been claimed by the agents of the Government at Washington.

It is suggested that the intervention be a joint one by Great Britain and the United States. The latter Power is the self-constituted protector of South American Republics; and to some extent it has a natural right to be so.

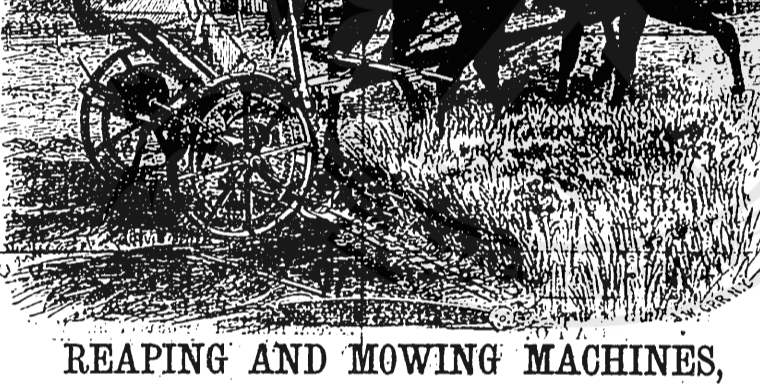
