SUMMARY FOR THE FORTNIGHT.

THE SANSAPARILLA REVOLUTION.

Scarcely had the ashes of the un- fortunate General Flores been laid in their last resting-place, hardly had the Government been installed, and law and order established, that the news comes to us of another revolution in that unhappy country.

Maximo Perez, the strap of Soriano, has flung down the gauntlet to the legitimate authorities of the land, and rekindled the torch of civil war.

It seems that Perez made no secret of his intentions, as many were aware that the moment his removal from office would be attempted the signal of civil war would be given.

The full extent of Maximo Perez's programme is not yet known. His animosity to the Ministers is notorious, and there are numerous parties here who assert that he will not lay down his sword until the whole power and authority of the Government is placed in the hands of the Flores faction.

The Montevidean Government has displayed neither foresight nor judgment in this Soriano squabble, and betrays a most pardonable innocence of the character of Maximo Perez in summoning him to resign before first placing him in irons.

It is difficult to suppose that the disputes between Perez and the Government were of such a character as to forbid all arrangement. The post of Gefe at Soriano is not so important as that an equivalent could not be given; in fact, we believe that there are coacheans and railway guards in this city who would not exchange places with Soriano Perez.

It may be that this Maximo Perez revolution will blaze-but for an hour and then die out, but the alarm which the affair has caused on the Sansaparilla banks of the Rio Negro and which has extended to Montevideo, moves too clearly that the disturbers of the public peace are old hands, and calculated to give much trouble.

Under these circumstances it might be expedient for the Minister to take Mr. Cornelius O'Dowd's advice, which if it had been adopted in England would have saved that country from the outrageous expense of a war with the Gefe Politico of Abyssinia.

But let it not be supposed that there is any exaggeration in the foregoing news; every newspaper in Buenos Ayres has already published the glaring and awful fact that Lopez had commenced recruiting women!

The only difference is that we give the news more in detail, having at our command superior information from the exact number of the women under arms in Paraguay at present it is impossible to say, owing to the varied and conflicting statements, but for years past a great portion of the heavy work attending on camp life has been performed by the unfortunate daughters of that once lovely country!

It may be obedience, it may be enthusiasm or it may be patriotism which drags the whole female population of Paraguay with muskets and sabres on the hill tops and in the valleys to fight the invading army but we would despair indeed, for the cause of humanity did we think for one moment that the unconquered Paraguayan heroines lacked the unequalled sympathies of the people of this country.

History affords us many instances of very brave female warriors, but the world must be gone over again before we can find a single instance of a heathen or christian army of women marched out in battle array to fight an army of men soldiers.

The great error, now, which the allies committed in allowing Lopez to escape from Humaita, is palpable. The power of this man over his people was never properly estimated by the allies; in his dening women to fight in the front and withdrawing his men into the interior of the country, he has placed the allied army in a predicament far more serious than if he had defeated Casias in a pitched battle.

THE ENGLISH CEMETERY. We have refrained from alluding to this subject, of such vital importance to the most cherished interests of the foreign community, because, being a topic which more particularly affects the pecuniary interests of the British community, we felt a delicacy in being the first to call the attention to the manifest injustice of the measure, not so much for the paltry question of £ s. d. involved therein, as upon the broad basis of international polity and reciprocal courtesy.

Since, however, the other two organs of foreign interest in Buenos Ayres, the *Zetina* and the *Courier de la Plata* have already unequivocally pronounced their reprobation of the unjustifiable step taken by the Municipality, and even the native press is beginning to make deprecating comments thereon, we shall venture also to make some remarks, and state some facts which may not be within the cognizance of the general public.

About the year 1821 the Englishmen residents in this city obtained from the then Government a general charter in due form for the establishment of a Protestant Cemetery. A short time afterwards a small plot of ground was purchased near the Socorro Church, which for several years was used as the Protestant burial-ground; its reduced dimensions, however, soon found inadequate to the increasing wants of the Protestant community which was rapidly augmenting in numbers and importance.

SPECIE PAYMENT SETTLED. The declaration of the Minister of Hacienda, in the Chambers on Saturday, took all this city by surprise, and if any reliance can be placed upon the casual promise of a Minister, then is the specie question settled. Mr. H. Varela's old motion brought the subject before the House. Many of the members expressed their opinion on the question, and apparently a sharp dispute was about to ensue, when the Minister of Hacienda stepped forward and stated that there was no national bank in the country.

old triumph over the tyranny of Rosas, and professes to have sought to place it by a political organisation, which would secure liberty, but would at the same time repress the evils of political cupidity and passion. He abuses all considerations of party spirit, and vanquishes by the force of the material prosperity of the country in regard to the Province of Entre Rios itself, General Urquiza reminds his hearers that the Constitution of 1822, still in force, was founded on the model of that of the United States, which—the General remarks in parenthesis—was a federal Constitution.

The works of the central Uruguay Railway are progressing. About the 10th of next month Mr. Pealer's portion of the work will be concluded. The earthworks will then be finished from the saladero of Maso to Las Piedras. Owing to some delay, on the part of the mason contractor, the work entrusted to Mr. Pealer has been somewhat put back. There can be no doubt that, after all, the sea wall was a great mistake. It will cost about 800,000 patacons, but the Company expects to reap this much and more, from the amount of ground they secure by it.
