BRAZIL.

An Alagoas journal is responsible for an account of a discovery of a human skeleton by the laborers engaged in the making excavations for the bed of the tramway in construction at Maceió. The skeleton was found in sandy soil and around it was a kind of stone wall, set with mortar. On the bones were a shield with inscriptions. a sword and some silver and gold medals or coins supposed to belong to an epoch anterior to the Christian era: The skeleton appeared to be that of a man of colossal, really gigantic size, and its bones were petrified and dazzlingly white. It is also silent on the point whether the sword belongs to the bronze or the iron era. 
