ANOTHER COLLISION. To the Editors of the Standard. Gentlemen— Allow me, through the medium of your valuable paper, to put before the public the following account of another serious collision:—On Friday, June 5, we sailed from Rosario at 2 p.m., for Buenos Ayres, and at 6.50 p.m., we being then at a place called the Cancha de Soldado, sighted a steamer coming up stream, which turned out to be the English steamer Castor. My pilot at once ordered the helm to be put hard-a-port, so as to take our proper side. I then took the night glasses and looked, and found that said steamer was heading straight for us. I made this known to the pilot, who told the man at the wheel to go close in-shore, as there was plenty of water, which was done, we being at this time about ten yards from the shore, said steamer still heading for us. I ordered my engines to be stopped and backed full speed, which was done, blowing the whistle at the same time, but all to no avail; the Castor struck us on the port bow, about twenty feet from the stern, cutting us under the water's edge, the engines of the Castor still going full speed, until I called out to the captain to stop his engines, which he then did. I then ran my ship on shore to keep her from filling forward, and to put a plate on, so that we might be able to proceed to Buenos Ayres. In the meantime, the Castor got under weigh and proceeded on her voyage without even asking if I required any assistance.

WOOL CROWING IN CALIFORNIA. (From High California.) Wool growing continues to be, as it has been for the last fourteen years, the most profitable branch of agricultural employment in California, and it is more profitable here than in any other country. Our climate is peculiarly favorable to sheep. They need neither shelter nor cultivated food; at least most of them never receive either. The weight of the fleece is ten per cent, that of the fleece twenty per cent, and the increase almost one hundred per cent, greater here than in the Eastern States. Besides the sheep generally live longer. The increase of sheep in this State is from ninety to one hundred per cent. of the number of ewes, two years old or over and the increase of the ewes over all loss is about thirty per cent. One shepherd can take charge of 2,000 sheep, and the common wages are \$35 per month, with board, which costs \$10 per month, making \$45 per year. About 3,000 acres of land are required for pasturage, and the interest on the cost is \$300, making a total of \$840, or 25 cents per head for the ordinary annual expenses. The yield of wool averages 64 pounds per year, and prices, if the quality is good, are from 18 to 25 cents. A gentleman, of much experience in the sheep business, lately sold 3,000 ewes for \$4 each, or \$12,000, and after the sale calculated the profit that the purchaser would make in two years to be \$22,750.

Money is as tight as ever, and the bills expected from head-quarters have not yet arrived. There seems to be little chance of any improvement in this market until things look better in Montevideo. The telegrams announced nothing beyond the fact that the Montevideo notes are refused everywhere, but private letters received state that there is yet some prospect of an arrangement being made. Messrs. McColl, Estros, and McKinnon, have had interviews with the Minister. Whether it will amount to anything or not remains to be seen. Speculation in the Manu notes is as rife as ever. One broker sold 200,000 on the Montevideo Baza yesterday, but the price not stated. Here there have been some sales at 10 per cent. discount. Exchange on Montevideo 51d., equal to 49d. here. The rate here looks stiff at 69 1/2, a good many drawers. About 422,000 passed up on the present.
