LATEST FROM MONTEVIDEO. Montevideo, June 12, 6 P.M. Business paralysed. Exchange upon London done at 51; upon France, 250,000 francs passed at 5.20 to 5.30.

THE ARNO'S MAILS.

The Royal Mail steampacket Arno arrived here yesterday morning early. She left Rio de Janeiro on the 6th inst. at 10 a.m., and experienced fine weather during the voyage.

GREAT BRITAIN. London 9th May. Mr. Gladstone's second and third resolutions in reference to the Irish Church were passed on the 7th inst.

After the principal resolutions as to the Irish Church had been passed amidst vociferous cheering, Mr. Laing brought a motion which stood in his name, postponing any further action to the new Parliament.

During the last few days the most circumstantial accounts of the marriage of Middle Patti to the Marquis de Caux have found currency, mainly on the authority of the Paris 'Figaro,' and partly because, simultaneously with the fair 'prima donna's' departure from Paris, the Marquis, who is member of the Emperor's household, obtained leave of absence.

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insertion of the House by the Government, to which Mr. Disraeli, having returned, replied. Eventually the words proposed by Mr. Gladstone were added the amendment, which was then put as a substantive resolution.

The discussion raised by Mr. Aytoun having been disposed of, it only remained for Mr. Gladstone to move that the resolutions be reported to the House. This he did, and Mr. Disraeli could not refrain from what Mr. Bright afterwards called "a parting shot."

The trick of the Government in placing the Scotch Reform Bill second on the orders for Monday was exposed last night in the House of Commons by Mr. Gladstone, who insisted that some change should be made in this arrangement.

We are glad to see a report to the effect that the untried Fenian prisoners now confined in the Irish gaols are shortly expected to have a complete release granted them by the Irish Executive.

Secretary Sir Stafford Northcote has received the following telegram from the Commander-in-Chief in Abyssinia:—"Dalanta, April 21. 'Upwards of 30 guns and mortars were destroyed in Magdala. Fifteen of the guns from 6 to 50 pounds. Five of the mortars from 6 to 20 inches calibre. Gates of Magdala blown up, and every building burnt on the 17th; nothing but blackened rock remains.

Magdala and its fortifications have been entirely destroyed. The British expeditionary force commenced its return march to the coast on the 18th inst. All well.

At to-day's sitting of the Customs' Parliament, the address brought in by National Liberals in reply to the speech from the Throne came on for debate. Herr von Benningens, the reporter of the committee, supported the address, and Baron Thungen opposed it.

At to-day's sitting of the Customs' Parliament a motion was passed respecting abolition of the drawbacks on export dues, which France, in contradiction to the stipulations of the Franco-German Commercial Treaty, had granted to her railway companies by improper calculation of the amount of the import duty.

A petition of agriculturists from the province of Prussia was presented to the Customs' Parliament stating that preparations for a thorough reform of the Customs' tariff are urgently necessary. The Bill for a reform of the tariff before the Parliament was far removed from fulfilling what was required. A protest is appended against the tax upon petroleum.

Vienna, May 7. The Presse of this evening publishes the following statement characterising as received from a trustworthy quar-

ter at Berlin.—"We understand that Count von Bismark, feeling convinced that in view of the claims put forward by Denmark no immediate agreement upon the North Schleswig question is attainable, will at once address himself to Vienna, with a view of arriving at a solution.

The Epique of the day asserts that the guaranteeing Powers have simultaneously presented a note to the Roumanian Government demanding that an indemnity should be paid to the Jews.

The Patrie of this evening states it is probable that an international commission will be appointed to consider the Tunis Question. The Bourse has been firm.

Yesterday the Pope blessed and presented to the troops two rich standards—one from the United States and the other from Barcelona. His Holiness delivered a speech on the occasion, in which he very warmly maintained the justice of the defence of his right to the integrity of his temporal dominion.

The 'New Prussian (Cross) Gazette' of this evening publishes letters from Paris and Vienna, which it states come from reliable sources, and according to which no ill-feeling is felt in Government circles, either France or Austria, on the subject of the meeting of the Customs Parliament, notwithstanding all the assertions of French journals to the contrary.

Herr von Blankenburg warmly advocated that the House should pass to the order of the day, which was opposed by Herr Bluntschli, who maintained that the Customs Parliament must declare its concurrence with the national idea expressed in the speech from the Throne. Only enemies of the Confederation could vote for the order of the day.

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Mr. Williams delivered a long argument, based upon grounds similar to those advanced by Mr. Boutwell. Mr. Everts, for the defence, then commenced his argument. He claimed that the Senate was a Court governed by laws, otherwise it was an altar of sacrifice to partisan hatred.

Mr. Sumner proposed an amendment to the rules providing that a majority shall determine the final judgement after two-thirds shall have decided the question of conviction or acquittal. Bill to admit Louisiana, Arkansas, North and South Carolina have been introduced in the House of Representatives.

It has been officially announced that the New Constitution has been adopted by North Carolina and Louisiana.

On Thursday some burglars entered an English boarding house in Calle Parque, and completely sacked the house, taking with them the boots and shoes of the lodgers, knives, forks, spoons, tea-pot, and even the cups and saucers. Such a wholesale burglary has not for years been known in this city. The burglars got in about 3 o'clock in the morning. Serenas, as a matter of course, absent.

Our advices from the camp districts continue to be of a most unfavorable nature, it is feared now, that when the rain does come the losses will be severe, owing to the danger of the heavy frosts, in most districts the camps are extremely bare, still there is more grass and the sheep are fatter than in 1859 when we had that desolating storm which swept off millions of sheep and ruined hundreds of poor farmers. There have been several large sales of sheep during the week, but at such low prices, owing mainly to the great scarcity of money, that they are not worth quoting. In the South, good mestiza sheep in prime condition can be bought picked for \$20 m/c, which is indeed a ruinously low figure.

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We are happy to say that we have received no confirmation of the melancholy tidings of Mr. Bankart's assassination, although we have received a recent letter from the Cufiapiru mines. We trust therefore that there is no authenticity for the rumour. We note that the Montevideo papers also discredit the intelligence.

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The age for one-story houses in this city seems to be rapidly passing away. Building sites have become so valuable, that all new houses growing up in central parts are two and even three stories: and even the proprietors of houses are building upper apartments on the top of the old house. Dr. Tejedor, in Calle San Marti, has built an additional story

to his house, at a cost of \$100,000. This house where Mr. John P. Boyd's office is, will shortly be pulled down to make room for a large three-story building. The bank is also about to build, on its present site, and will tear down the house now occupied by Mr. Tomkinson. Mr. Martinez de Hoz is about to put an upper storey on his house in Calle Belgrano, and Mr. Charles Jackson has now nearly finished another two-story mansion in Calle Temple. Such a rage for building, notwithstanding the high price of materials, was never before known in town.

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EDITOR'S TABLE.

The Arno made a good trip this time: she arrived at Montevideo before nine o'clock on Thursday morning, and entered this port at daybreak yesterday. She brought no gold, but a full list of passengers, amongst whom we note Mr. Thomas Drysdale and family, who for the last year have been travelling in Europe and the United States; we welcome them back to the River Plate.

This steamer Patagonas is posted for to-day, but it is probable that she will not get away before Monday. She gives free passage to all English laborers and mechanics who desire to settle in Patagonas.

The La Plata sailed on Wednesday. We notice amongst her passengers Mr. Couto, the well known broker, who retires to his native hills in Lisbon, to spend the rest of his days; he has accumulated a snug fortune of £15,000, which he has put into National Bonds. The number of brokers who have retired on commission fortunes, is something astonishing.

The Oneida in her last trip out from England to Rio brought £142,000 in English gold for that market.

The commercial news by the packet is not so very favorable. River Plate produce is down slightly: markets weak. River Plate securities are about the same, but all stocks on the London Exchange are looking downwards.

We hope in a few days to be able to lay before our readers a succinct statement of Mr. Robinson's plan for paving and water supply. We learn that it is infinitely cheaper than the project now before the Legislature, and therefore ought to be preferred. Mr. Robinson has come to town to see about the matter.

Dr. Avellana, late Minister of the Province, has opened his office as a lawyer. He stands first in his profession, and is regarded as one of the best legal advisers in Buenos Ayres.

Another contingent of troops for the war has arrived at Montevideo, and another is about to be despatched by the Argentine Government. In all about 700 men. When will this contingent business terminate? The troops from here are said to be volunteers, yet the National Government has asked for fifty soldiers from Gov. Alsina to guard them.

Our commercial friends must not forget that on the 16th the period for taking out Patentes expires, after which there will be a fine incurred.

The Hipparchus sailed yesterday. She took a heavy mail, as it is general-

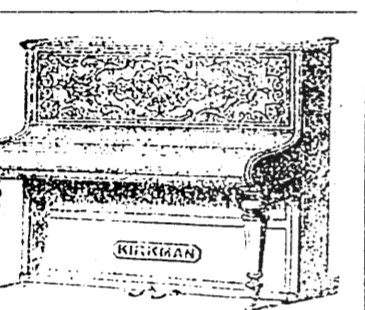

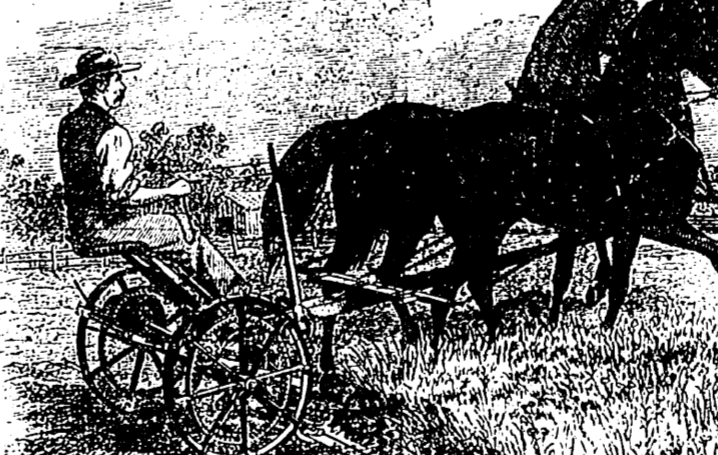
