Among the passengers she takes home is Mr. Hadfield, the enterprising proprietor of the "Brazil and River Plate Mail," who after a short visit to these regions, during which he has been able to examine closely all the material improvements in our city and its neighbourhood, returns home more than ever convinced of the bright future that is in store for these favored countries.
