THE MONTEVIDEAN CRISIS.

The period has at last arrived when people can see through the heavy end, prove a salutary public lesson. The Free Banking fever which seized but strictly just. the public mind some four years ago, led to no great results in the Argentine Republic, owing to the sheet au-Bank enjoyed, and which then incurred such censure, and even opprobrium. Montevideo was held up to us as a model from which to form our bankieg system. There no anti-republican privilege, no South American monopoly domineered with despotic sway; a general banking

law, framed on the most liberal principles, ruled throughout the republic, which gave birth to all the various enterprises that stamp a nation's greatness, and even paved the environs of the city with roads which outrivalled in magnificence the historic highways of the Incas. The cheapness of money, the abundance of capital, and the grand expansion of credit, gave a seeming prosperity to everything Montevidean. The Oriental, when he visited Buenos Ayres, pointed with pride to his city, which, although with inferior trade and not half the inhabitants, had outstripped Buenos Ayres on all the avenues of social and commercial

progress. Few then anticipated that a banking system which worked so admirably and produced such shining results, could ultimately lead to a crisis that has made the nation bankrupt, and almost severed the very bonds which hold society together, yet such is the indisputable fact. The present crisis is solely and absolutely owing to the rotten free banking system that has sprung up in that market; paper money became so cheap, so abundant, that it did not assist specie, but positively displaced it; even small change which in most countries is represented by silver and copper coin, in Montevideo was reduced to the most frivolous of all paper issue. Such were the facilities for starting banks, that we do not exaggerate when we say the only capital required was the amount necessary to pay for a signboard and counters, stationery and plates for striking off the notes. Bank managers were thrown off their guard

by the instantaneous circulation of their notes, and in fact the aim and object of their trusts was solely to lend out all they could, and collect in nothing.
