marked attention from the government. The ordinary revenue in 1867 amounted to \$9,756,838, being an excess over 1866 of \$2,559,727. With the exception of the Mint, all the branches of the revenue have yielded an increase in 1867 over 1866.

The standing army has been considerably reduced. The fortifications of Valparaiso have been concluded, and are considered to be adequate to repel any attack on our chief port. The national marine will soon be augmented by the two corvettes that sailed from the Thames on the 2nd of April last, in virtue of an arrangement between our Minister and Lord Stanley.

On the occasion of the opening of Congress some ill-bred persons hissed the President, but the ringleaders have been put in duress vile; and it is to be hoped that they will be kept there long enough to teach them better manners for the future.

The agreement entered into in London between the representatives of this country and Spain with Lord Stanley relative to the sailing of the embargoed vessels of their respective nations, has given rise to a considerable amount of angry discussion, both here and in Peru.

The Government, consequent on its determination to promote immigration to our southern provinces, has issued a decree under date of the 15th ult., in virtue of which persons desirous of settling in the colonial territory of Llanquihue are permitted to take up double the quantity of land stipulated in the original decree relating thereto.

November 20.—Started at 5 a.m. The road first is through a fine wood coasting the Tebicuarí. Emerged into marshy plain with great numbers of water fowls.

November 21.—Left Villa Franca at 6 a.m. by a road that leads through a beautiful grove of high trees; we again saw here the palm tree which we had left to the south of the Tebicuarí.

Advices from Paraguay amount to nothing. Large orders are said to have come down for supplies. Cabal continues as provisor for forage. It is said that some consignments of Paraguayan yerba have passed into the Banda Oriental, per Santo Tomé.

The Corrientes trouble is much discussed on 'Change. The news brought down by the Uruguay steamer is very different from that received by way of Corrientes.

In Exchange the rate rules the same, closing to-day at 49½ takers. About 200,000 passed. The result of the meeting of shareholders of the Italian Bank, appears to have been the nomination of a committee to decide upon the best course for the shareholders to adopt.

The new deposit stores alongside the Quinta de Fair, now Lowry's, were at last begun to-day. 150 workmen are now hard at work, and this immense scheme, it seems, will be at last carried out, the concessionaries having at their disposal sufficient funds to carry out the work.

To-morrow the new launches of the River Plate Steam Navigation Company commence to ply in the river. They are built expressly for this river, and of very light draught, capable of holding 100 tons under cover.
