THE AGRICULTURAL COLONY OF ROSARIO (B. O.)

The Waldensian colony of Rosario (B. O.) has a Directory named from its members, composed of a President, an accountant and a treasurer, who reside in the capital of the Republic. In the colony there is a manager who corresponds directly with the President of the Society. The colony is divided into five sections, each with a capataz from among the colonists themselves.

The farms consist of three squares (300 yards) frontage, and 12 (1,200 yards) depth, or 36 squares square. Each lot is composed of eight farms having 12 squares (1,200 yards) frontage by 24 (2,400 yards) depth, with roads on every side 15 yards wide, and perfectly straight.

Almost all the farms are surrounded by ditches. The backs, although mutually guaranteed, are, nevertheless, secured by ditches. There are about half a million of poplar trees planted at the sides of the ditches, low lands, roads, groves, &c. There are several vineyards, producing a good deal of grapes, and some of the colonists manufacture wine for their own use. There are several orchards of trees, particularly peaches.

The manager's office is in the Villa la Paz, where there are, besides, sixteen brick houses, one with arched roof, four with azoques, two with tiles, three with galvanised pipe roofing, and six thatched. Among these a steam flour mill, and a windmill, which are constantly at work, one blacksmith, two bootmakers, one tailor, one saddler, one carpenter, two master masons, and three retail stores. In the farms there are two retail shops, several masons, carpenters, boot-makers, and other trades. Almost all built brick houses on their farms, and bun bricks in kilns made in country fashion.

When the Evangelical Church is built in the Villa de la Paz, several colonists will also raise good houses there. The school in the Villa is provisionally under the management of the colonial clergyman. A proper rector is expected from Europe. On the farms there is a private school for boys, and another for girls, supported by the parents of the girls that attend it. There is a Protestant Cemetery enclosed by a good brick wall, with an iron gate, where are buried the Protestants who die not only in this colony and the Swiss colony, but also in the estancias included in the section. The colonists are allowed the use of the monte [wood] during five months of the year, viz., from April 1st, to August 31st. They ask of the manager to lease to cut what they require, and obtain from him a written order, so that the monte-keeper may not hinder them from cutting. This slight restriction has been established to prevent the abuses that occurred at first, and which would in a few years have completely destroyed the monte. The mending and preserving the public roads of the colony, is done by the neighbors by turns. The sectional capatazes etc attend personally to the works on the days on which their respective neighbors are

called upon. The manager furnishes meat, powder, and trains, and pays for the daily mending of the tools used in extracting stones, making cuttings, embankments, &c., of the roads, and directs the works.

Almost all the families that compose this Colony are subjects of the King of Italy, inhabitants of the Alps near the sources of the Po, known as Waldenses, and profess the Evangelical worship. They have a clergyman who performs divine service, and every Sunday they receive the Sacrament in a place ceded to them by the Society until they get a church.

The congregation is represented by a consistory composed of the clergyman, ex-officio president, four elders, and two deacons. Everything relating to religion and morals pertains to the Consistory. Nobody does any kind of work on Sundays. For the support of the clergyman the colonists have agreed some time ago to give him every year two fanegas of wheat for every farm. It is the duty of the Clergyman to perform divine service every Sunday, visit the sick, and console them with the word of God; to instruct the catechumens above twelve years in the Christian Religion, and prepare them to receive the communion; to baptize, and marry those of his religion. The manager with the concurrence of a majority of the Colonists has formed internal regulations which embrace all that is done in the colony, and he appoints four members as a commission to assist him in the work entrusted to him, so that the colonists themselves may accustom themselves to attend to the work and interests of the Colony in general, that increase yearly in material importance.

This colony was founded in 1858, and in 1862 the last call on the shares was paid up. About two months ago the shareholders received a dividend of 33 per cent. on the original value of the shares.

The Rev. Mr. Pendleton holds 18,508 francs which he collected in Europe by voluntary subscriptions to erect in this colony an Evangelical church and manse. As the consistory backed by the Government refused to allow him to employ this fund in the building of a church upon his own farm, he returned to Europe, carrying the money away with him. The colonists are about to raise, by voluntary contributions, a small church in the Villa de la Paz.

THE WAR IN ABYSSINIA.

General Order to the troops on leaving Abyssinia. Soldiers of Abyssinia.—The Queen and people of England entrusted to you a very arduous and difficult expedition, to release our countrymen from a painful and long captivity, and to vindicate the honour of our country, which had been outraged by Theodote, King of Abyssinia. I congratulate you with all my heart on the noble way in which you have fulfilled the commands of our Sovereign. You have traversed, often under a tropical sun, or storms of rain and sleet, four hundred miles of mountainous and difficult country; you have crossed many steep and precipitous ranges of mountains more than ten thousand feet in altitude, where your supplies could not keep pace with you. When you arrived within reach of our enemy, though with scanty food and some of you for many hours without either food or water, in four days you passed the formidable chasm of the Bashilo and defeated the army of Theodote, which poured down upon you from their lofty fortress, in the full confidence of victory. A host of many thousands have laid down their arms at your feet. You have captured or destroyed upwards of thirty pieces of artillery, many of great weight and efficiency, with ample stores of ammunition. You have stormed the almost inaccessible fortress of Magdala, defended by Theodote, with the desperate remnant of his chiefs and followers. After you forced the entrance, Theodote, who never showed mercy, distrusted the offer of mercy which had been held out to him, and died by his own hand. You have released not only the British captives, but also those of other friendly nations. You have unloosed the chains of more than 90 of the principal chiefs of Abyssinia. Magdala, on which so many victims have been slaughtered, has been committed to the flames, and remains only a scorched rock. Our complete and rapid success is due, first, to the Mercy of God, whose hand, I feel assured, has been over us in a just cause; secondly, to the high spirit with which you have been inspired. Indian soldiers have forgotten the distinctions of race and creed to keep pace with their European comrades. Never has an army entered on a war with more honorable feelings than yours; this has carried you through many fatigues and difficulties. You have been only eager for the moment when you could close with your enemy. The remembrance of your privations will pass away quickly; but your gallant exploits will live in history. The Queen and

the people of England will appreciate your services. On my part, as your commander, I thank you for your devotion to your duty, and for the good discipline you have maintained. Not a single complaint has been made to me against a soldier or villagers wilfully molested in property or person. We must forget what we owe to our comrades who have been labouring for us in the sultry climate of Zoula and the Pass of Koomayle, or the monotony of posts which have maintained our communication. Each and all would have given all they possess to be with us, and they deserve our gratitude: I shall watch over your safety to the moment of your embarkation; and to the end of my life shall remember with pride that I have commanded you.

AUSTRALIA.

AUTRAGEOUS LAW PASSED. A telegram has been received at the Colonial Office stating that the Duke of Edinburgh left Sydney on the 6th April, so that he should arrive here in a few days. John Bull is responsible for the statement that, on the return of the Duke, the Privy Council will issue a form of thanksgiving at his recovery, to be used in churches and chapels. The wretched man O'Farrell, notwithstanding the generous request of the Duke that his life should be spared, was executed on the 21st April. He retracted his statements as to the Fenian origin of the plot and the drawing of lots, and charged himself alone with the conception and execution of the design. He denied that the purpose was known to any other person. The atrocity of this act seems to have sent the New South Wales people fairly out of their wits. They want to change the name of their colony, while the Legislature has passed, in a single day, a measure against treason-felony, by which the most elementary safeguards of personal freedom are deliberately sacrificed. Every person not joining in a loyal toast is liable to immediate prosecution under its provisions; the publication of any news disrespectful to her Majesty, even for the purposes of condemnation, is made a penal offence; any person proposing a peaceful separation of the colony and the mother country is liable to penal servitude for life, &c. The good colonists have evidently lost their heads, and the sooner they recover them the better.

GOSSIP ABOUT ENGLISH AUTHORS.

The London correspondent of the Chicago Tribune gives some pleasant gossip about men and women in the literary world:—Mr. Anthony Trollope is still credited with the desire of entering Parliament. He has several politicians at his pleasant country house, and to take an interest in who are 'in' and who are 'out' but I am inclined to think that the phases of human character rather than the varieties of policy attract him, and that he will always be more at his ease when on his hunter galloping after the hounds—his favourite sport—or when sketching the 'Thimble Phuns' of fiction, than on his legs at a reform meeting, or even on a bench in the legislature at Westminster.

Madame Blanc de Bury is writing a clever story for Mr. Trollope's magazine, in which her knowledge of the French character serves her well. She is little known in this country, less than in Vienna or Paris, and has written more for French periodicals than for those of England.

Mr. Arthur Helps, who assisted the Queen in her late book, is publishing a sketch, from month to month, in his favorite form of dialogue, similar to that which he followed in his 'Friends in Council.' In a pleasant way he reproduces many of the good things he has heard or uttered in the very good society which he enters. A thin kind of plot hangs the whole together.

Charles Lever, a few years ago, completely altered the style of his novels. He obtained a good deal of popularity by dashing stories of military life and duels, and daring exploits, such as 'Harry Lorrequer' and 'Charles O'Malley,' when the Tories got him a consulate in Italy. Always at his pen, he began to write simply humorous tales in which the absurdities of English travellers were peculiarly conspicuous. He then got soberer, and attempted the purely satirical tale. This not succeeding, he began to venture more upon sparkling dialogue, and sent out one of the smartest works of the time called 'Sir Brooke O'Fossbroke,' in which a few leading people in Ireland were caricatured. Ireland is his country, and it seems to be always in his thoughts. His last story, still unfinished, entitled 'The Brambleighs of Bishop's Folly,' is half Irish, half Italian, and though, as I have said, in absolute contrast in matters of style and construction to his better known productions, is worth a better place in English literature.

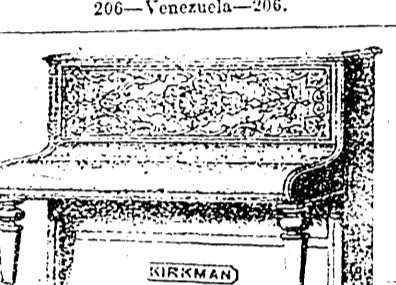

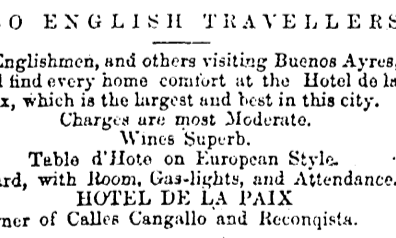
