We received yesterday our usual exchanges from Montevideo and some of the interior provinces. From Cordova to the 3d inst., and Entre Rios to the 5th. The news from Corrientes is highly contradictory, and whilst the Entre Rios papers sing praises at the victory of Caceres over his enemies, a correspondent of the 'Tribuna,' under date of the 5th, announces the total defeat of the same Caceres by a Comandant Insurreccion, and adds that all the Entre-Rianos, under Col. Bread and Water (Panigua), and those under Colonel Ojeda, have disbanded, leaving these renowned chiefs to wend their way alone to Esquina...

We find the following particulars about the wreck of the Parana, in the 'Telegrafo Maritimo.' She went aground on the 16th June, 5 miles to the South of Cape Antonio. The vessel that went to convey assistance was on account of bad weather obliged to lie off two days—on the third day on going alongside, the Captain of the Parana communicated having sold the ship and her cargo by orders of his consignees Messrs. Freyer Bros., of Buenos Ayres in \$14,500 dollars paper currency. The ship was considered as lost, but the greater part of her cargo might be saved. The Captain was interested both in the ship and cargo. His wife and four children were on board. The crew had struck and refused to work.

The following is the substance of the two bills presented by the Montevideo Government to the Oriental Chambers, and which are likely to be sanctioned—1st. Authorising the Government to adopt what measures it may deem will lead to the conversion of the bank notes emitted by the various banks up to the 30th May last, for which purpose the Government is also authorised to engage the national credit. 2nd. Authorising the Government to raise a loan of 500,000 dollars for the necessities of the public service, for which purpose leave is given to impose such increase in taxation as may be deemed necessary to repay the principal and interests of said loan.

The Uruguay, which is considered as the official organ of the Entre Rios Government, says—"We know that the Provincial Government has decreed a new organisation of the National Guard infantry, and that they will soon begin to be drilled. It is well that the people's soldiers should acquire the necessary knowledge that may enable them duly to fulfil their duty when called upon. For the present the National Guard will be drilled only on Sundays."

The Orientales in Gualeguychu are making great preparations to celebrate with great pomp the 18th of July. H. M. S. Greyhound, Captain Stirling, leaves again to-morrow for Montevideo. The Captain favoured us with a visit; also some of his officers, who spent agreeably a couple of hours in our museum, overhauling the many curiosities of our renowned collection. Buenos Ayres seems to have made a favorable impression upon them, and we hope soon to see them again. The Greyhound is an old vessel remodelled, and carrying heavy armament. Four 64-pounders and one 100-pounder.

On Sunday last the inauguration of the Quilmes school took place, and was presided by Dr. J. Bautista Peña, and attended by a large concourse of notabilities from town. Several excellent speeches were pronounced on the occasion, one particularly good by our talented young friend D. Santiago Estrada. The flow of good spirits and excellent liquor lasted throughout, and the effects of it were discernible on several of the party on their return home by the train.

The Tycho Brahe, whose arrival in Montevideo yesterday was telegraphed at an early hour, brings dates from Liverpool of the 5th. She brought also forty passengers. She will be up here to-morrow, and be despatched again on the 17th inst. with passengers and mails.

To-day, being a close holiday, our paper will not appear till Saturday. We shall publish on Sunday our packet edition for the French mail that leaves on that day.

Mr. Baraille made his appearance as announced, in the Plaza Victoria yesterday at 2 p.m. with his monster balloon, but owing to an escape of gas he was obliged to go back to the Gas Works to have it refilled, and came back at 4.30 when he effected his ascension alone in rapid style. The balloon took a southerly direction and if no mishap has attended his landing we are to witness a second ascension to-day.

IMPORTANT FROM THE FORTIN OF CARMEN DE ARECO. Carmen de Areco, July 6. It is better to be reader of Athenian history than a citizen of Athens. The same may truly be said of this town, which presents to the view of the most superficial observer an amount of misery unparalleled in the Argentine Republic. As you approach the town from any quarter you behold the people basking in the sunshine at the doors of their huts, not a soul of land upturned, neither a vegetable plot nor garden mound raised, nothing that betokens life or animation is to be seen; a more desolate, dreary sight could not be witnessed among the Hottentots or Bushmen of the African plains.

It is a mystery how many of these people live, without work, without industry, without commerce of any kind, and yet as far as appearances lead it is time. Some at least must have a business, for horse stealing has become a common practice for months past, the rich and the poor being sufferers indiscriminately. Cattle stealing likewise has become a practice of common occurrence for many months. I have observed in many places the cattle chained on the pastures during the day to prevent their being stolen. There is a private killing ground some few leagues from the town, which some report says is doing good business, but the butchers have within a few days petitioned the Juez de Paz to stay further proceedings, as it is to them a public injury, and to many a supposed cause of loss to have a slaughtering ground where the animals are not seen by a government official.

I hope the Juez will seriously consider the matter, as he has lately proved himself equal to his exalted position by fining the proprietor of a gambling-house, and each party therein at the time, notwithstanding the said proprietor being a member of the municipal body, and a right hand supporter of his lordship.

There are several matters for the Municipality seriously to consider, that is, if they are inclined to reform, or partake of a feeling for the welfare of the public, for, deprived of these principles, that body had better cease to perform its functions, as otherwise it is a mockery, a delusion, a farce, and, at best, a public imposition.

As far as regards the health and accommodation of the town, nothing can be conceived in a state less conducive to the advantage of either. Let us review the scenes that are of daily occurrence in the cemetery, or rather the charnel house of the dead. The space originally enclosed, and as it stands at present, without addition, or diminution, is not sufficiently commodious to accommodate one hundred families, and what, with increased population, and the mortality occasioned by the epidemic of the past summer when for weeks thirty and forty were daily interred, until no space was left for further interment, and when coffins were piled on coffins; then mounds were raised on a level with the outer wall, as it were a trophy of death, nothing can possibly be conceived that requires more an immediate consideration from the Municipal Body. The bodies deposited during that time have now to be exhumed, as occasion requires, and the materials of which the greater number of coffins were composed, in consequence of their hurried manufacture, easily go to pieces, and expose the bodies to view.

Is it not possible to visit the graves of the dead without exciting the horror of the living? Is not this revolting and dangerous to the health of the people? Where are to be found all which remains of those who but recently enjoyed life to the fullest extent. Cannot the grave secure an undisturbed sepulchre? Cannot feeling command from the living to the dead a place where their earthly remains may repose in peace? Cannot affection, friendship, or gratitude command it? Is it a testimonial of respect which we know not how soon we may require from our successors, and shall it not be given to those who have preceded us? But, in this, what is the common usage? It is that which acts in defiance of the common feelings of nature, and cannot be surprised by the most barbarous age of the most uncivilized people.

There is not one twentieth part of the requisite space appropriated in the present cemetery, and the occupier of a grave becomes merely the tenant of an hour, until he is brutally disinterred to give place to some more recent traveller passed to regions beyond the grave. What reason can be assigned that every human body, no matter how humble or obscure the position he occupied in life, should not possess an undisturbed sepulchre? Is not the matter worthy the consideration of the Municipal Body, and not less deserving the attention of every individual that his dust should repose in peace? The callous indifference of the people to this matter is truly astonishing and forms a striking contrast with the great nations of old, and the untutored savage of every age and clime. The honor of a civilized nation, the reverence to the memory of the dead, and the health of the living equally require that the obnoxious and inhuman practice of displacing those but recently interred, to make room for the still more recently dead, should be done away with for ever, and that sufficient space, and in proper situations should be appropriated, for the purpose, which, kept in order, would be an Eden of charity in the desert of the age.

THE HANOVERIAN HEGIRA. In your Weekly Standard of the 27th June, I met with the following notice:—"The whole Hanoverian nation is computed at about 3,000,000, and of these at least a third will come and settle in our hemisphere, and probably the rest may follow at no very distant period."

Besides you publish in the same number, under the heading of "Great German News"—"That the mal-content Hanoverians, who, faithful to their Monarch, left the Province of Hanover, can never return to Prussia."

Both items of news have, in no small degree, surprised me, and allow me to tell you that you are not well-informed. I myself am a Hanoverian [at present a faithful Prussian and a good German], and taking much interest in the affairs of my native country, you will oblige me by publishing the following translation, from the weekly edition of the Wезer Zeitung of the 9th of May:—"The poor Hanoverian legionaries, who are at present mostly lodged in Rheims and its environs, begin to feel
