The Royal Mail Steampacket Arno

there was no probability of the new

Parliament being able to meet, except

for the very shortest time, before

Christmas. Its meeting then could

only take place under the most fa-

vourable circumstances, and therefore

the Government thought it right to

take the votes for the whole year. The

Government, he assured the House,

had a burning desire to get out of the

"almost intolerable position" in which

they were placed, and to appeal to the

country; but they could not hasten

the elections materially. He prom-

ised to defer the report of supply until

Monday, in order that the ques-

tion might be then discussed, if the

Opposition thought it necessary.

We learn that the City of Brussels reached Falmouth on the 7th of June, all well on board. The next steamer of the Tait's line, which was called at Falmouth on the 18th June, had a full list of passengers engaged, and had to refuse several applications for passage to the River Plate.

We read in the New York papers of a gigantic swindle in connection with the purchase of vessels of war for the Peruvian Government. Two so-called agents of the Peruvian Government, named Dominguez and Milar, had made a contract with Mr. John Graham for the purchase of the Dandenberg and the monitors Onota and Agamentius, for the sum of a million and a half of dollars in Chilean and Peruvian Bonds, which turned out to be a hoax.

A subscriber, Mr. J. A. Newham—late of Montevideo—writes to us from Brighton to inform us that since the month of November last he has not heard from his son, James Newham, whom he left with Mr. Alt, manager of Baron de Mau's estancia of Currupe, Soriano, near Mercedes, and that being unable to get any intelligence about him, he is afraid that his son may have fallen a victim to the cholera when that epidemic was raging in Mercedes.

The crisis continues as bad as ever, and notwithstanding the combined efforts of bankers, shopkeepers, brokers and Ministers, specie is almost impossible to be had; the Government wearied of useless projects have at length adopted active measures, and whether with a view to restore confidence or diminish the National expenses have determined to disband the

National Guard, which ever since the commencement of this disastrous business have been actively employed in keeping order; since the closing of the banks these imprudent functionaries have had little to do, and whilst effecting a considerable saving to the National Exchequer, no man will deny that they will be better employed in their respective walks of life.

Notwithstanding the efforts of Mr. Bankart in Cuiapiru, the premium on gold continues. Everything has risen in value, and even the price to places of amusement is spoken of as likely to be increased. Colonel Fortunato Flores arrived here yesterday from Rio. He made a farewell address to the Brazilians on his departure, thanking them for their hospitality during his exile.

The Brazilian steam transport Appa, which left Rio on the 30th ult. with 230 recruits for Paraguay, sprung a leak and had to put into Isla Grande. The Bonifacio was despatched to assist her. On the 18th ult. the Bourgoyne arrived at Bahia, and on the 24th the La Plata.

At the Barrea de las Bovedas, the property of D. Avelino Lerena, an important discovery of petroleum is said to have taken place, at a distance of four feet from the surface. The crisis continues as bad as ever, and notwithstanding the combined efforts of bankers, shopkeepers, brokers and Ministers, specie is almost impossible to be had; the Government wearied of useless projects have at length adopted active measures, and whether with a view to restore confidence or diminish the National expenses have determined to disband the

financial point, has commenced badly. The produce news, by the Arno, is unfavorable: salted hides 6½d.; wools down; tallow 45s. 6d. It is feared that on recent shipments there will be a heavy loss. Another bank failure was announced to-day, and in a quarter where least expected. The Entre Riano Bank has stopped; it was a joint-stock concern, of limited capital, and with about half a million Bolivian dollars in emission. Although the stoppage is not slightly felt here, it is generally believed that it will lead to a crisis in Guayaquil, causing a run on the other banks, and ultimately compelling them to close also. The affair has caused much attention, particularly amongst dealers.

From Montevideo there was nothing particular; everything, for the present, seems to be clothed in uncertainty. Another change of Ministry is talked of. Speculation in bank bills continues as of old. The protest of the foreign merchants has had great effect in the Government-house, and increased the difficulties surrounding any recurrence to forced currency. Exchange for the supplemental mail was done to-day at 90d. 10/100 in sterling, and one million in francs. Drawers, Messrs. Leizaola and Lanuz, army contractors. The transaction being so heavy an amount, and by new drawers in this market, caused much attention: takers London and River Plate Bank.

The City of Brussels arrived in Falmouth on the 7th ult. It is remarked that she landed the very large sum of £136,000 sterling from South America. None here knew of her taking so much specie. The Arno brought on freight £25,000 in gold for the Mana Bank in this city. Repeating National Bonds, it was rumoured on 'Change to-day that a very large amount of 'debtors' would be brought to the Bolsa on the 13th inst. Before the grave was filled up, the nuns passed around it in procession, each throwing flowers upon the coffin, and taking a last farewell of the Sister who had gone to reap the reward of her generous and disinterested life.—May she rest in peace!

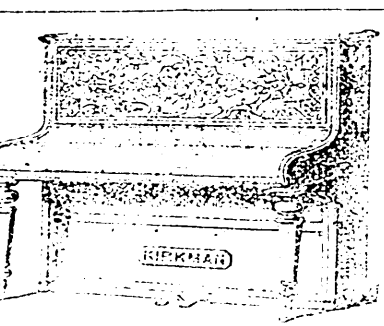

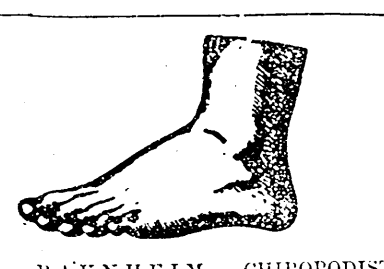
