SR. SARMIENTO'S RESIGNATION.

Argentine Legation, Washington, 24th March, 1868.

M. le Ministre. With the note enclosing the decree of 25th January by which I am appointed by H. E. the President, Minister of the Interior, I have received an official copy of the Law of the San Juan Legislature dated the 12th of the same month, by which I am elected Senator to Congress.

The fact too notorious to be ignored that two Ministers are the candidates that divide public opinion, if it did not compromise the dignity of government, would debilitate the unity of action so necessary, depriving one or both of the political meaning of being the spontaneous expression of public opinion in those provinces, that are free from the influence of "that immoral compact and electoral intrigue" so energetically condemned by H. E. the President in a document that has seen the public light.

been well-treated in that respect by Sir M. Peto, the contractor. With regard to the debentures, the directors had powers given them by the proprietors to issue debentures to the extent of £50,000, and they had determined not to borrow any more money than they could possibly avoid, but they found great difficulty in issuing the debentures even at 7 per cent. He took up £10,000 of them, another director £5,000, and some of their friends other amounts. As they had to borrow money at 10 and 12 per cent., he advised them, as soon as convenient, to convert the existing debentures into a permanent debenture stock.

They were greatly indebted to the care and exertions of the local committee and to their principal officers in Buenos Ayres Mr. J. Fair and Mr. G. Drabble had just returned from Buenos Ayres; they were large shareholders, and would, he believed, confirm the statement in the report as to the position of the property. [Hear, hear.]

Mr. S. Herapath, a director, seconded the motion for the adoption of the report. He said, in addition to the solidity of their line they had a progressive traffic. The gross receipts for they year 1867 showed an increase of 34 per cent. over those of 1866, and in the net profits an increasing of 83 per cent. The receipts per train mile amounted to 11s. 2 1/2d., and the expenses to 6s. 6d. per train mile, against receipts of 9s. 6 1/2d., and expenses of 7 1/2d. in 1865, showing an increase of 1s. 7 1/2d. in the receipts and a decrease of a 1 1/2d. in the expenditure, being equivalent to a net increase of a 1s. 9d. per train mile, and a profit of 4s. 8d. per train mile for the year 1867.

Another matter was that they did not carry on the railway more than one-third of the traffic in the district, leaving two-thirds of the existing traffic untouched by the railway, while it was carried by the ordinary modes of conveyance. At the same time the railway was creating a new traffic for itself in the shape of suburban traffic, and also a grain traffic which would not have existed without the railway.

The permanent way and rolling-stock were in good order; the working expenses had been reduced from 70 per cent. to 58 per cent., and would, no doubt, be further reduced as the traffic increased.

PRUSSIAN PROMPTNESS IN MILITARY AFFAIRS.

It is well known that the Prussians owe a great deal of their astonishing success during the war of 1866 to the unexpected rapidity by which they contrived to surprise and defeat their enemies. They have now given in Abyssinia another proof more of this "flash-like" quickness.

General Napier after having achieved the purpose of the Abyssinian expedition, ordered the British troops to return home. A final review was held at Dalsulo, on the 20th April, where the proclamation just issued by the general, was read to the army. He expressed in it his gratitude for their constancy and discipline so gallantly displayed, congratulating them also upon the most satisfactory result of the campaign.

Same manoeuvres were executed then by the troops which concluded the review.

On this occasion, the following fact which is not bare of general interest, came under public notice. Of those foreign officers, the two Prussians (Lieutenant Stumm and Count Seckendorf) had assisted in the expedition from its earliest beginning, having arrived in Abyssinia at the same time with—strictly said, even before—the British vanguard. The Frenchman arrived just in time to witness at least the principal events of the war. But, as regards the Austrians, these came by far too late! There had been no chance for them to see Magdala, as they met the British army already prepared for marching home.

Thus, the Prussians had outdone both the Austrians and the French. It is very likely that in the war which—it is expected—will probably break out ere long between France and Germany, the Prussians will have a good opportunity to give further proofs of their rapidity and readiness. Such invaluable military qualities must, undoubtedly, lead to most decisive results.

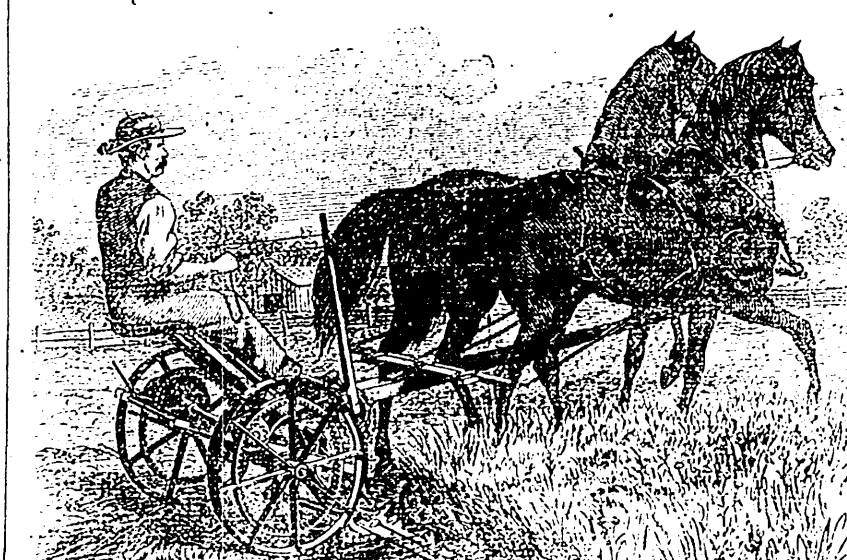
