#### THE FALL OF HUMAITA.

Who cares whether Turmeau has sold all his famous tea or not? Now that Humaita has fallen, social matters are forgotten, and domestic cares eventful intelligence.

The news of the fall of Humaita came for the moment, even the most sanguine believed it "too good to be true." People rushed to the mole and the On the Bolsa the wildest excitement dentials as Brazilian Minister. reigned, and the jam at the Telegraph Office was perfectly terrific. Mr. Furze, following telegram:however, was equal to the emergency, and till midnight he subjugated electricity to convey the hidden thoughts of men.

We who have such a varied experience of this place in moments of the most intense excitement admit that vesterday afternoon the long pent-up feelings of the whole population seem" ed to have given way, and possibly for the first time since the commencement of this war there was a "Cead mille failtha" for the Paraguayan news. We publish at foot all the particulars as yet at hand respecting this glorious turning-point of the campaign, and may we, in a moment so felicitous, express a hope that it will prove the real urning-point of the war, and that the occupation of Humaita by the allies may not prove a sterile victory, but be for us all the true harbinger of an mmediate victory.

It, indeed. requires an immense fund of patience to hear superficial statesmen assert that foreign nations have no right to interfere in a struggle, the importance of which none but South Americans can understand, nor should foreign powers aid the despotic sway of Lopez by proposing mediation.

But the allies have themselves to blame for all this-first, by squandering so many valuable years in a campaign which, in the hands of a Hopfirst twelve months; and secondly, by borrowing money abroad from unsophisticated foreigners, who never can. and possibly never will, thoroughly comprehend South American politics.

However there is a tide in the affairs of war. With what dignity could not the Allies have withdrawn from this struggle, when they drove the Paraguayans across the river and freed Corrientes? But none then ever dreamt of coming to terms. Again, when the Brazilian ironelads mocked the vaunted power of Humaita, and rode triumphant over the trumpery chain, peace could have been extended to a ruined nation, yet unconquered race; but the Allies, blind to everything, save the Triple Alliance, lost the chance. But now it has again returned. We have ever and always preached peace, guided by no other motive, save instinctive humanity; but certainly, we do say, that of all periods, since the commencement of this war, the present is the most desirable for peace negotiations.




