

I must, before all, begin by declaring to Y.E. that the information which has caused such disagreeable surprise to the President is incorrect—and it is to be regretted that it should have been the motive for the adoption of measures which are not calculated to 8ecure the re-establishment of law and order in the neighbouring province.

Since the date of the notes exchanged with Y.E. in reference to those events there has been no further calling out of troops in the province. The only force under arms is the National Guard of the frontier districts. Y.E. left to the judgment of the Government to decide the number necessary to proteet it. But, even without Y.E.'s authorisation, it is the duty of this province, and it has the right to defend its.own territory whenever it may be

The inhabitants of the frontier of Entre Rios have taken up arms to defend their homes, because a revolutionary army being arrayed against the forces that sustain the legitimate Government of Corrientes, and an engagement being imminent on the very frontier of this province, it is to be feared that the territory of Entre Rios may be violated by one or other of the belligerents, and property be jeopardised by fugitives or by armed bands taking advantage of the hapless situation of the province of Corrientes.

This Government dreads not the vociferations of the rebels against the authorities of that province, or the very National chiefs whose mission can only be the pacification of Corrientes and the re-establishment of or der. 


