Art. 2. The overland trade is hereby suppressed; and merchandise for which a dispatch may be asked for the Argentine Republic, will be understood as solicited for home consumption, unless re-embarked for the seaports of said confederation.

Art. 3. No merchandise will be allowed to enter except through the passes of the Cordillera, where there are custom house stations established.

Art. 4. Before dispatching merchandise entering by way of the Cordillera the officers in charge of said stations will require a policy to be presented in duplicate, signed by the person introducing the merchandise...

Art. 5. The officer in charge of the stations will examine the merchandise and live stock and estimate their value according to tariff, stamping it on the policy, under their signature.

Art. 6. The officers in charge of stations will transmit to the custom house to which they are accountable, one copy of the policy in order that the proper charge may be noted thereon.

Art. 7. The amount of duties collected by the officers in charge of the stations shall be remitted under their own responsibility to the nearest Deputy Collector of Customs at the end of every week...

Art. 8. The treasuries to which the Deputy Collectors are accountable shall credit the respective Custom Houses with the amount of duties received by their deputies...

Art. 9. Before anyone can be permitted to enter free of duty tobacco contracted for by the General Factory he must present to the officer in charge of the station a free pass from the factor expressing the numbers and marks of packages...

Art. 10. All provisions of the Custom House regulations relating to trade with the Argentine Republic are hereby abrogated.

A WORD TO RAM BUYERS. The approximation of the period when our sheepfarmers will be in the market to supply themselves with rams, presents an opportune occasion to make a few remarks to intending purchasers.

It cannot be too earnestly impressed on sheepfarmers that the selection and acquiring of good breeding stock is of vital importance. It is a question on which hangs their whole future success or failure...

We hope and trust—for the sake of sheepfarmers' interests—for the sake of progress and civilisation—that we shall never hear a repetition of the old argument: "Wool is worth so little, and sheep are so unuseful, that it won't do for us to buy dear rams. We must economise; and if we can get rams at \$200 or \$300, instead of \$2000 or \$3000, why it's so much saved."

reverse is the fact is incontrovertibly proved by the fact of the utter absence of accommodation for housing sheep in the Cabafia of Mr. Latham; the two small sheds barely sufficing for the rams that are being prepared for sale.

Mr. Latham has achieved no mean success in his efforts to produce stock that is calculated to improve our flocks in a very marked degree, and we are confident that the result of his sales will prove that his efforts have been duly appreciated.

THE SEAT OF THE WAR. The present position of affairs at the seat of war, has been variously pictured according to the political leaning of correspondents. We believe the true version to be as follows:—The garrison of Humaita numbering more or less, three thousand, escaped as we all know by degrees on to the tongue of land immediately in front of the fortress...

Among the two thousand and odd that remain in the peninsula are women and children. On each neck of dry land to the south of the peninsula, and on the shores of the narrow passages of the lake, the allies have batteries, and to the northward the Paraguayans are exposed to the attack of the ironclads.

Continual skirmishing is taking place by land and on the lake, according as the enemy increases his efforts to escape.

The Brazilians made one serious attack by land to force a passage through the necks of land, which on the map appear like legs, of the peninsula. This attack was smartly repelled. The present intention of the Brazilians is to throw into the lake, through an opening into the main stream of the Paraguay, a few bomb-ketchers, to scour the place of the enemy. In all likelihood the Paraguayans that remain on the peninsula will then have no further chance of escape.

On their surrender, Lopez will have no object in continuing to defend the battery of Timbo, where he has about 1000 men. These he will endeavor to withdraw to his principal standpoint, the Tebicuarí, where he is posted on a neck of land exposed on two sides to attack by water with vessels of light draught.

Meantime, the Allies will occupy Asuncion as soon as Timbo is taken or abandoned, and the rest of the campaign is in the chapter of accidents we can all of us partly foresee.

LATEST FROM MONTEVIDEO. August 4th, 1868. The important topic of the day is the new Government Loan to which we alluded in our former number—some of our brokers are preaching it up, and when the terms of the Loan become more generally known, we have no doubt that the public will discern in it a safe and profitable mode of investing their spare cash.

The following items we publish on the best of authorities. The Loan is to be styled "Empresita Aduanero," the amount of it is to be as we before stated \$400,000. Of this amount \$200,000 are to be paid at once, and the remainder one year from the date which the bonds will bear.

The Government is willing to receive offers for payment either in gold or paper and it is to be supposed that the latter mode will be that which purchasers will prefer.

Both the interest of 8 per cent. per cent. per annum and the amortization are to be paid monthly. Should the loan be effected for gold, which would be preferable to the government, the interest and amortization would be made payable in the same metal, but if it be made in paper then the government will respond to its compromises in Bank notes, or more correctly speaking, legal currency. This appears to us to be a very fair arrangement.

As previously mentioned the debt will be guaranteed by the lands on which the Custom-house stores will be placed, by the Custom-house stores themselves, and by the Custom-house store-rent which the edifices will produce.

The buildings are to be fire-proof, and erected between the Herrera stores and the Custom House: their capacity will be greater than that of the whole of the Montevidean deposits of which the city can boast. In two years they are to be finished, and it is calculated that then the Government will get a return from them of \$20,000 per month, putting the rent at 20 cents the metre, whereas at present we are paying for outside stores at the rate of 40 cents per metre.

Unfortunately, the want of confidence which is now felt in the stability of the existing Government impedes the 'placing' of these debentures; but, notwithstanding, the opening rate is spoken of as likely to be 90 per cent.

Owners of lands near town are now having them 'judicially' measured, and are placing new 'mojones' (landmarks). This fact leads us to believe that we shall soon see a few lawsuits; at the same time it shows that people

At the commencement of the second part of the concert we were favored by a semi-comic performance of the doleful "Misericordia" from the "Trovatore." With every wish to be otherwise, we cannot be quite so complimentary to Mr. Simonis, the violinist. He is, indeed, a violinist, and a good one too; but his nervousness, in the first place, seems to upset his mental equilibrium, and occasionally it narrowly escapes even worse consequences, that of upsetting himself or his music-desk.

But no such noble ambition fired the hearts of these humble traders; they spent the whole day passing from cartel to cartel, culling from the miserable relics of a starved-out, riddled, demolished, and almost razed fortress, the few paltry articles of worth which they could find.

The Gaul and the Roman who first entered the fortress give the history of their exploit in the following terms: Early on the morning of the 24th the pedlar and the baker pushed on to the outer lines of the Allied encampment; at one end of the outposts they were detained, but the laxity of the military discipline offered little impediment to the sturdy importunities of the dealers.

Having disposed of a few trifles to the soldiers, they struck into a path which wound around a lake that skirted the rear of Humaita, and passing through a small jungle wood they came upon an open space with a full view of the enemy's trenches.

The Ligurian at once suggested a retreat, but the Frenchman, true to the impulsive characteristics of his nation, insisted on advancing, as there seemed to be no fight going on, no belligerents of any description in sight. The hope of gaining a good market and the apparent safety of the expedition vanquished the fears of the Italian, and shouldering his pack he followed the intrepid Frenchman.

In crossing the open space in front they floundered for a few yards in a deep morass, then came upon a ditch broad and deep filled with water, and with earth thrown up on the opposite side; here was a difficulty which they had not anticipated, and possibly the siege of Humaita might be still going on; as the adventurers were about to return, but for some shots they heard in the wood that awakened them to the true dangers of their position; retreat seemed impossible—their only hope appeared to be in pushing on.

Unable, however, to cross the ditch at the point where they were, they struck out, following its course, rightly believing they must soon either come on a picket of the enemy or some rude attempt at a drawbridge. Strange to say, within almost gunshot of one of the Brazilian outposts they passed unnoticed. At last they came upon a part which was spanned by the trunk of a palm tree, and after some difficulty they crossed the fosse and climbed the earthworks.

For some moments after they gained the inside they lay on their bellies to escape notice; but perceiving with astonishment that there were no Paraguayans about, they directed their steps to a shed which lay a little way off; when they reached the shed they took a survey of the position—the place had evidently been deserted sometime, as there were no traces of fire having been kindled; the trees were all cut down, and about 150 yards further on they perceived a well-made wall of branches—called in military phraseology "abatiss." The

At the commencement of our commerce with the transandine provinces. According to Argentine advices merchants were preparing to order their goods from the coast of that Republic.

As regards the trade of this place, the decrees imports a notable decrease of its activity, for its profits were not confined to the sale of articles free of duty, but extended to the various occupations, commissions, &c., dependent on this traffic.

We subjoin the supreme decree just issued by Chile: Santiago, April 16th, 1868. Considering: 1st. That on the 30th inst. the treaty of free commerce concluded with the Argentine Confederation on the 30th of April, 1856, will cease to be in force; and

2nd. That in consequence thereof, on and after the 1st of May next commercial intercourse with the Argentine Republic will be subject to the general regulations prescribed in the Custom House laws for mercantile intercourse with other foreign countries; I have resolved and decreed:

Art. 1. Live stock and all articles of what nature soever, introduced by land from the Argentine Confederation shall pay duties according to tariff, the same as if they were entered by sea.

Art. 2. The overland trade is hereby suppressed; and merchandise for which a dispatch may be asked for the Argentine Republic, will be understood as solicited for home consumption, unless re-embarked for the seaports of said confederation.

Art. 3. No merchandise will be allowed to enter except through the passes of the Cordillera, where there are custom house stations established.

Art. 4. Before dispatching merchandise entering by way of the Cordillera the officers in charge of said stations will require a policy to be presented in duplicate, signed by the person introducing the merchandise and expressing the marks, numbers and contents of the packages.

In the case of live stock, it will be sufficient to specify in the policy their number and kind.

Art. 5. The officer in charge of the stations will examine the merchandise and live stock and estimate their value according to tariff, stamping it on the policy, under their signature. After examination, valuation and payment of duties in cash, they will be allowed to enter.

Art. 6. The officers in charge of stations will transmit to the custom house to which they are accountable, one copy of the policy in order that the proper charge may be noted thereon.

Art. 7. The amount of duties collected by the officers in charge of the stations shall be remitted under their own responsibility to the nearest Deputy Collector of Customs at the end of every week; and said officers shall hand in their accounts quarterly to the Collectors of the Custom House to which they are accountable together with the certificates of payment from the Deputy Collectors.

Art. 8. The treasuries to which the Deputy Collectors are accountable shall credit the respective Custom Houses with the amount of duties received by their deputies, duly notifying the Collectors thereof.

Art. 9. Before anyone can be permitted to enter free of duty tobacco contracted for by the General Factory he must present to the officer in charge of the station a free pass from the factor expressing the numbers and marks of packages and the kind of tobacco which he wishes to introduce.

Art. 10. All provisions of the Custom House regulations relating to trade with the Argentine Republic are hereby abrogated.

Art. 11. This decree shall go into operation on the 1st of May 1868. To be noted, communicated and published. PEREZ ALEXANDER REYES.
